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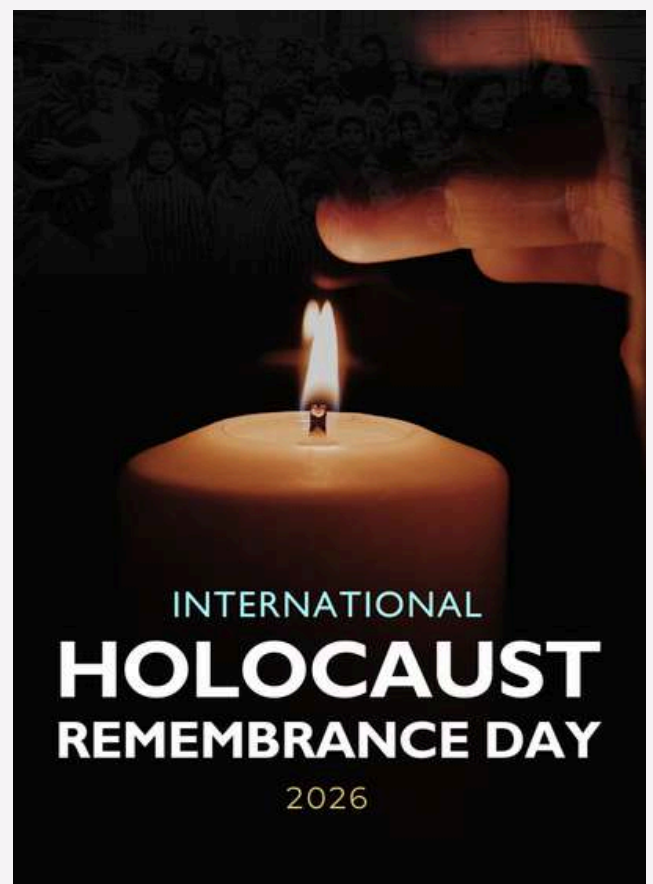


SMRCHS Chaplaincy

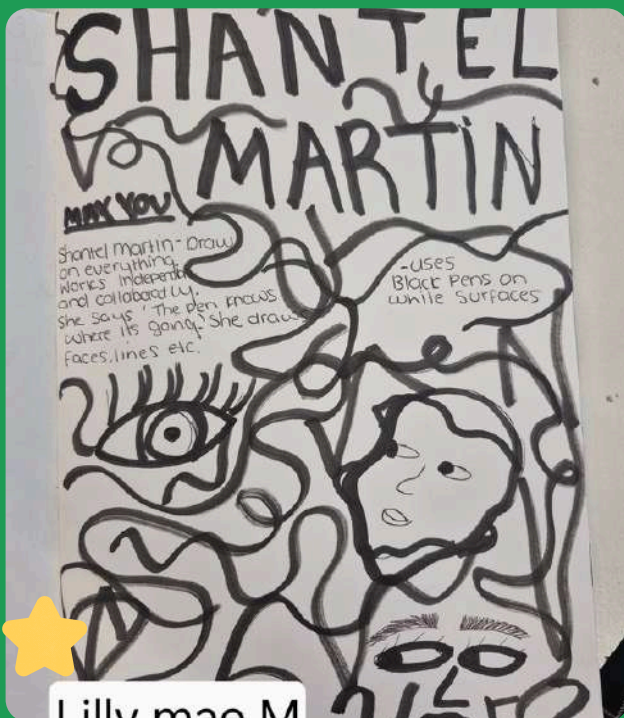

'Scenes of the Everyday'

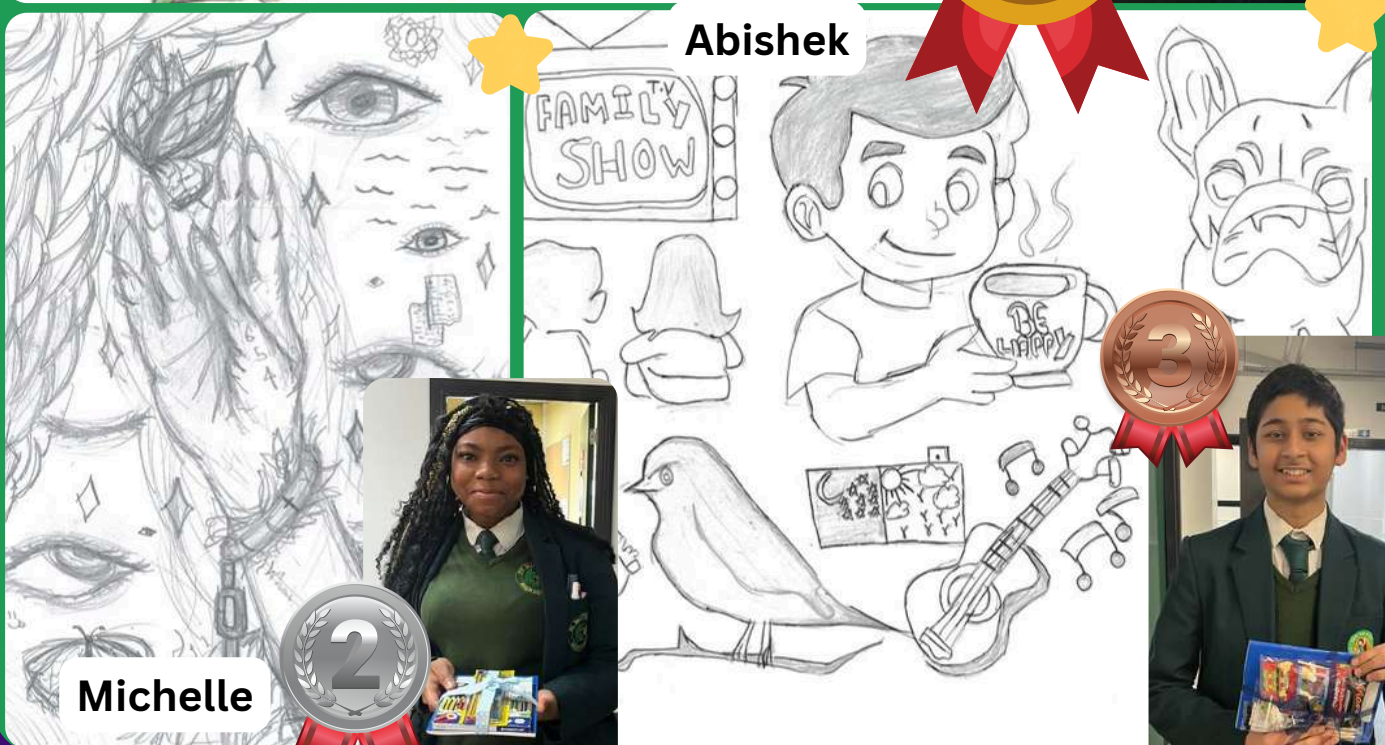


Congratulations to the winners of the 'Everyday Scenes' Competition!
