Year 6 SAT's tests.

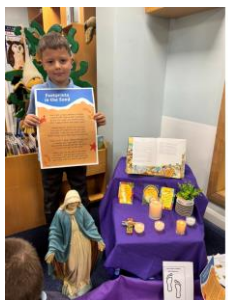
Congratulations to our Year 6 pupils who have completed their SATs tests this week.
