■ Our Lady's Fell Walkers – 13th June

Our Lady's Fell Walkers have two walks on **Saturday 13th June 2026** from the village of Howarth, West Yorkshire, home of the Bronte family, some of whom are buried in the local churchyard. There are lots of independent shops, cafes and pubs to visit, and the Keighley & Worth Valley Railway stops in the village. The A walk is 9.8 miles and the B walk 7 miles, both with a total height gain of 1400 ft. The A walk is faster and higher and the B walk, lower and slower.

We are a friendly group and everyone is welcome. The coach leaves from the corner of School Lane and Church Road, Formby, at 8am on the day and you can book your place by ringing 01704 878548. There is always an early stop for coffee/tea/bacon barmes and time after the walk to visit shops, cafes and pubs in the area. Please wear good walking boots or shoes, weather appropriate clothing and bring a packed lunch together with something waterproof to sit on. Sticks can also be helpful particularly at this time of year.
