What a typical maths lesson looks like.

We use Master the curriculum to teach 'small steps' and deepen understanding.

* Our lessons start with 'Daily Counting' practice in the form of chanting times tables, doubles and halves, division facts etc.

*We then follow up with F4.

* We regularly revisit prior learning.

* Our lessons then focus on mental arithemtic and written and mental problem and reasoning.

* On the class page of the website are some useful maths resources e.g. blank times tables grid.

* We always have a text, which our English


lessons focus on for a half term.

- * Grammar and punctuation is taught discreetly

through each unit of work.

- * Spellings are given on a Friday and focused on throughout the week in school and sent home to learn too. They are then checked the next Friday. Those children who access phonics have a bookmark of key words to know sent home.

Reading



Children are taught guided, which focuses on basic retrieval skills, vocabulary, inference and comprehension.

Throughout the week children also have the opportunity to read quietly and read their own books.

Our class author this term is Andy Shepherd and we are enjoying reading her book 'The boy who grew dragons' as a class.

We ask children to read at home regularly (4 times per week).

We do follow a reading scheme in school called Accelerated Reader and this closely monitored. It offers a wide range of genres to the children. Children earn points to get a privilege card.

Reading

- Phonics children were assessed during week 1 and placed in groups according to sounds they could recall, words they could decode and how fluent they were reading.
- Assessments are completed every 6 weeks but, if necessary, children will move between groups
- Children who are fluent readers in KS2 complete Accelerated Reader assessments and are given a ZPD where they can select books from the library.
- Assessments are every 6 weeks and ZPDs reviewed
- Reading records will be checked weekly as we expect children to read at least 4 times per week as part of their homework

Science

Science is taught for two hours on a weekly basis.

- * Homework is sent out on a Friday and due in the following Wednesday. As well as reading and times tables a writing or maths homework activity will also be sent home. I will email you all on a Friday to let you know what has been set.
- * A different times tables focus will be given each week and tested the following week. TTRS will improve children's recall and they can challenge me!



TTRS

Times Table Rockstars! This is for all Junior children.

In year 4 children will have to take a 'Multiplication Times Tables Check' or 'MTC' check.

The children are asked 25 questions which will be on the iPad and are allowed 6 seconds to answer the question.

These questions can vary between 0-12 x tables facts.

This is why TTRS is our best friend!

'Sound check' is available on TTRS and it is exactly like the MTC check so it is perfect for practice at home.

Attendance

As stated in the Returning to school September 2022 booklet:

- The Department for Education (DFE) have released further information with regards to the school day and expect children to be in school for 32.5 hours per week.
- Children must be at school for 8:45 am and registers will close at 8:55. Our school day will still end at 3:15pm. Due to the structure of our timetable for 2022/2023 teachers will be in class delivering teaching points at 8:45am, therefore, other members of school staff will be at the gates in the morning.
- The school gates will be locked at 8:55 although the car park will not be locked until 9am due to Adventure Clubs not starting until 9am. Children arriving at 8:55 will need to enter via the main entrance and will receive a late mark.
- Our attendance target is 97%
- Holidays, unless in exceptional circumstances and at the Headteacher's discretion, will not be authorised and fines will be re-instated as of the 1st of September 2022.
- As per our attendance policy, families who have attendance below our target will be invited in for a meeting and may require an intervention to be put in place.
