Explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes and link the spelling, sound and meaning of words.</div><div>3. Engage in conversations; ask and answer questions; express opinions and respond to those of others; seek clarification and help.</div><div>4. Speak in sentences, using familiar vocabulary, phrases and basic language structures.</div><div>5. Develop accurate pronunciation and intonation so that others understand when they are reading aloud or using familiar words and phrases.</div><div>6. Present ideas and information orally to a range of audiences.</div><div>7. Read carefully and show understanding of words, phrases and simple writing.</div><div>8. Appreciate stories, songs, poems and rhymes in the language.</div><div>9. Broaden their vocabulary and develop their ability to understand new words that are introduced into familiar written material, including through using a dictionary.</div><div>10.
