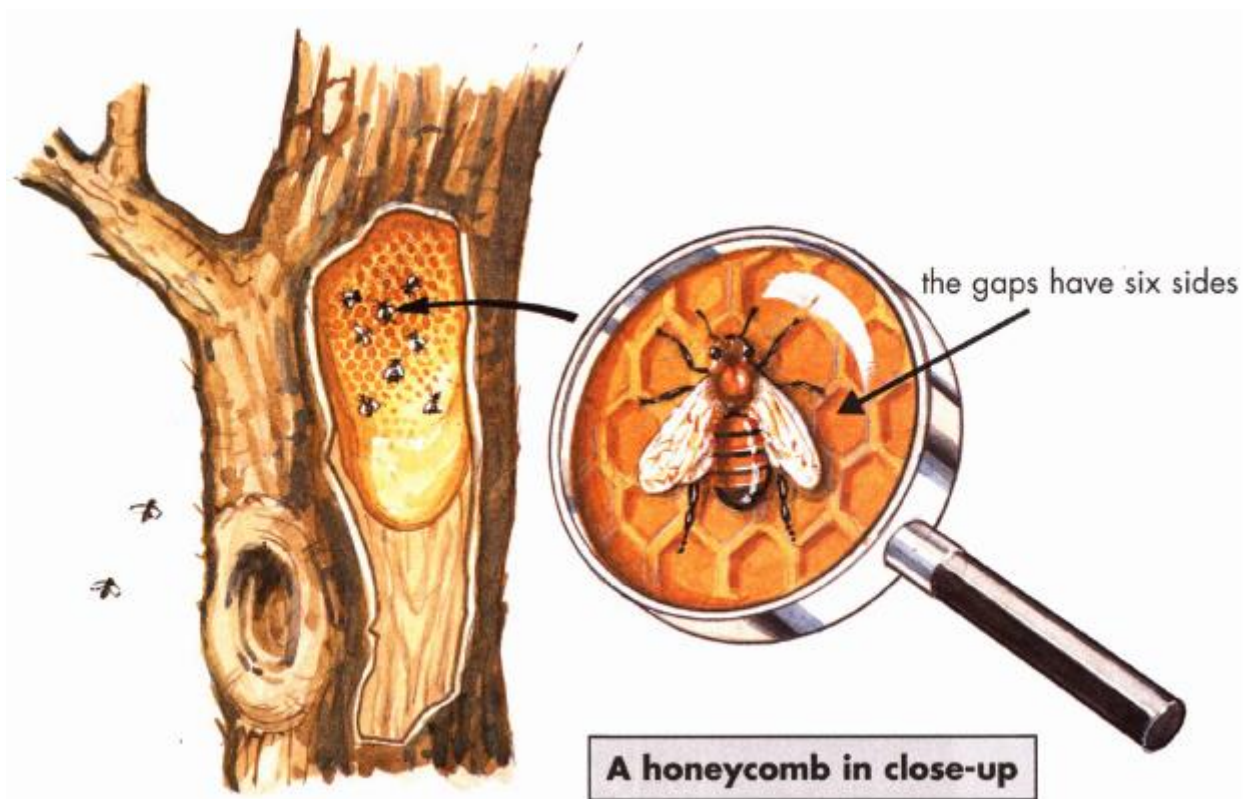

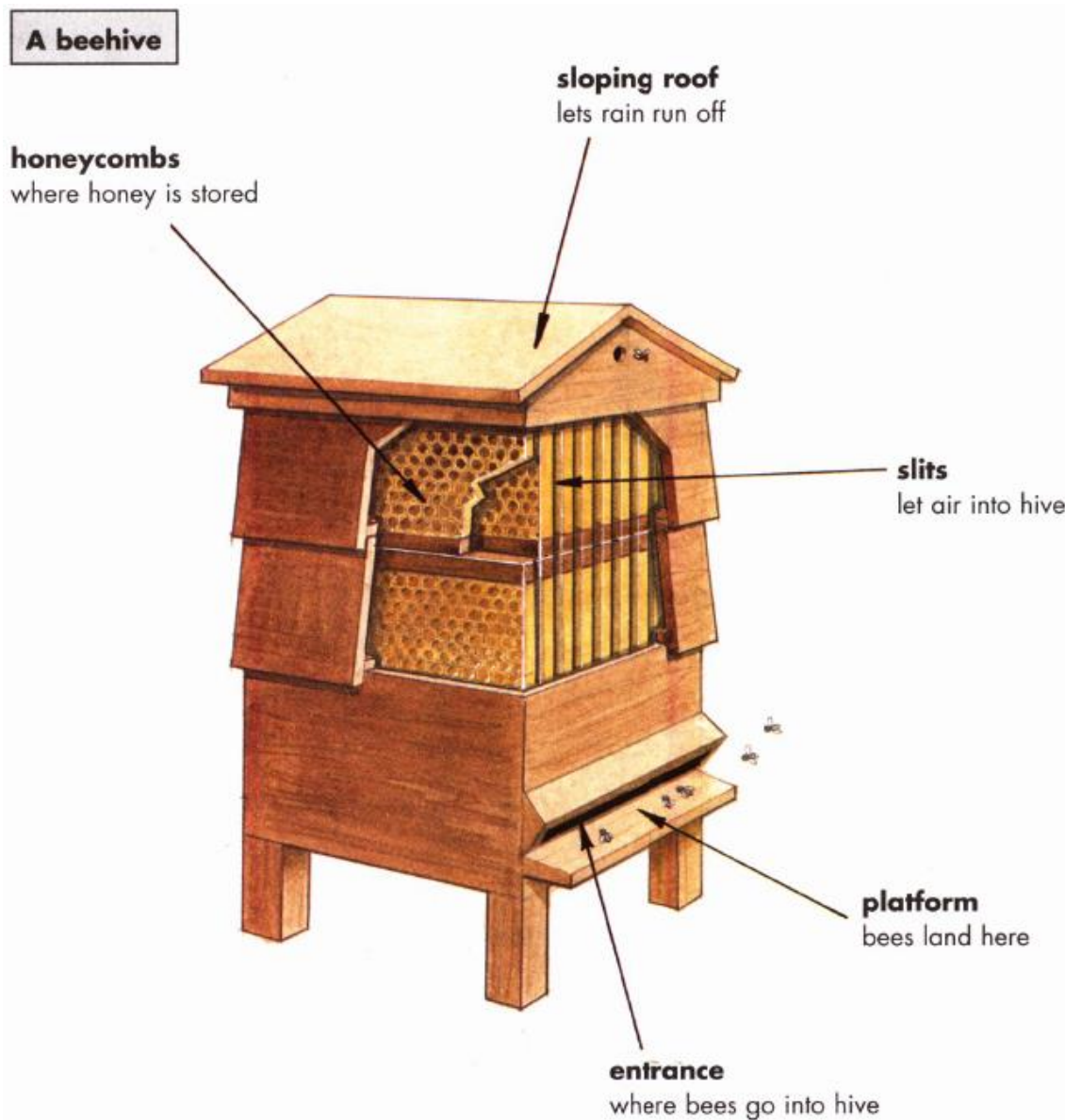

Bees fly hundreds of times between flowers and their honeycombs.

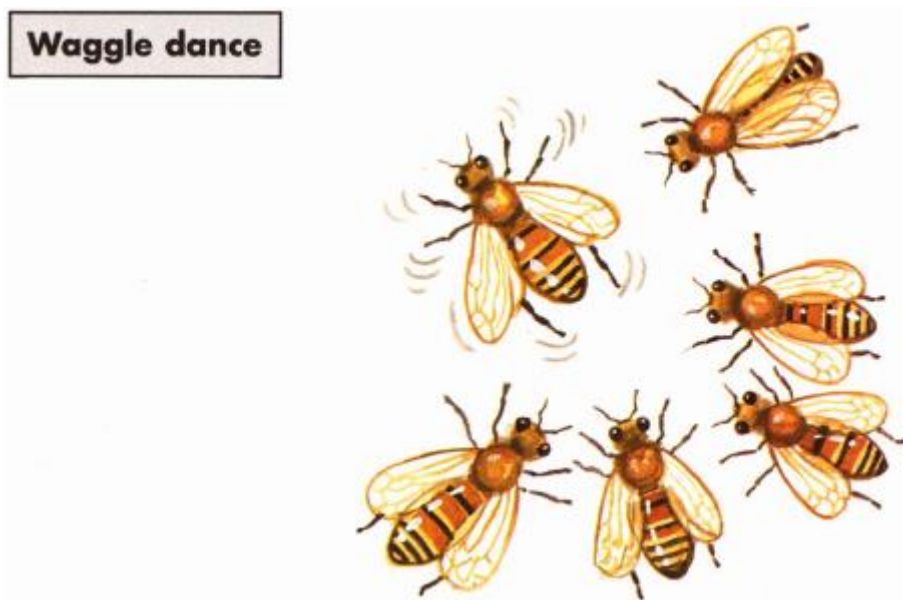

The bee's dance

When a bee finds a lot of nectar, it does a 'dance' when it gets back to the nest or hive. The 'dance' shows the other bees where to find the nectar.

Bees 'dance' by wagging their bodies and pointing the way to the food. If they waggle a lot, it means the food is a long way away.
