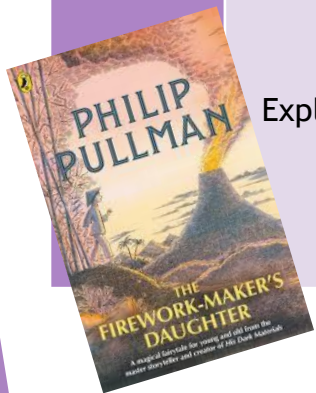

Reading Phase & Book Bands

In the infants, children are given reading books which are phonetically decodable aligned to the Red Rose Letters and Sounds phonics scheme trajectory. It may be that in order for gaps in your child's phonic knowledge to be bridged a books with the focus grapheme will be sent home from a previous phase to ensure confidence and fluency in word reading.

They may be reading a more challenging book in school during guided reading and when I feel they are confident at this in school, I will then move them up at home too.

When children are more fluent readers, they are able to recognise many words on sight and are able to use their phonic knowledge to segment and blend more complex words. The focus now becomes more on understanding of a text and comprehension. When listening to your child read, please also focus on discussion of the text, new vocabulary and understanding of characters thoughts and feelings.

Home Learning

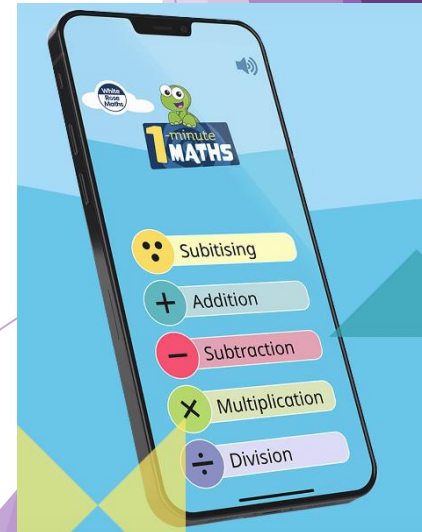


- ▶ Spelling home learning sent home on a Friday and will be marked and tested on Friday of the following week. Short, sharp bursts of regular practise will help spellings to “stick” better.
- ▶ Maths - Please encourage your child to access TTRS regularly throughout the week - at least 5 times of quick bursts and 3 times a week for a little longer. This will help them throughout much of their maths work...not just for the Multiplication Tables test in June.
- ▶ All log-in details for our on-line subscriptions are found in the back of your child's Reading Records
- ▶ Other homework may be set occasionally, this could be in in their homework books or on Purple Mash.



Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) June 2027

- ▶ The Questions
- ▶ There is a question bank of just over 100 questions from the 2 – 12 times tables. Although there will be an emphasis on 6, 7, 8, 9 and the 12 times tables as these tables are deemed to be more difficult. Each test will comprise of a total of 25 questions.
- ▶ The children must be able to read, recall and enter their response within 6 seconds – Therefore, rapid recall of their times tables is essential. There will be no time to work them out.

- ▶ To support those who struggle it's important they have a solid understanding of number. You can try the White Rose [Maths One Minute App](#). For those who struggle or need more speed with their timetables, please use the subitising, addition and subtraction sections alongside the multiplication section.
