

Focus on ... Year 3

Year 3 have enjoyed an action-packed week full of creativity, discovery and adventure. In Art, they travelled back to prehistoric times to explore how early humans made cave paintings. Using charcoal, they sketched animals by identifying key 2D shapes and blending to create tone and form. They also made natural paints from spices, filling the classroom with wonderful smells, and began building a giant cave-wall artwork with a textured, rocky background. Their historical journey continued as they learned about life from the Stone Age to the Iron Age. Working together, they placed key events on a timeline and used their "history detective" skills to understand how we know about prehistory. The children were fascinated to learn how archaeologists study objects to uncover clues about the past. Monday's Forest School session turned them into rock detectives. They searched the school grounds for different types of rocks, sorted them using a Venn diagram and examined them under a microscope, spotting tiny patterns and textures. In Computing, the excitement carried on as they used Scratch to build sequences of commands, experimenting and watching their ideas come alive on screen.

It's been a brilliant week of hands-on learning, imagination and exploration — with plenty more to come.

NSPCC
