Spring 2 RE Curriculum	
Reception	Easter is a celebration that Jesus is with us still. Lent is a time to care for others.
Year 1	Lent is a time to prepare for Easter. The events of the last week of Jesus' life and the resurrection.
Year 2	Holy Week. Lent is a time of reconciliation and forgiveness for Christians. Sacrament of Reconciliation. Easter Vigil Mass.
Year 3	The Liturgy of the Eucharist. The Last Supper, when Jesus celebrated the first Eucharist. Prayers and responses during Mass.
Year 4	Events of Holy week – gospel of Matthew. Parables – The Lost Son and The judgement of Nations. God's mercy and forgiveness. Lent – a time to live out the works of mercy.
Year 5	Ash Wednesday readings. Temptation of Jesus in the Wilderness. What is sin? What is conscience? Prayer is turning the heart towards God. The Rosary.
Year 6	Holy Week – gospel of John. Jesus as Messiah and how scripture shows His love. Mary – mother of all Christians. Stations of the Cross – prayerful reflection of Christ's journey to the cross.




Mini Vinnies

Our Mini Vinnies had a very busy Autumn term, especially during Advent. They visited our local care home to bring festive cheer, make Christmas decorations and sing some Christmas Carols. As a way of helping those in need, they also organised a Reverse Advent Calendar and all donations were presented to Hope Central Foodbank.

A small donation was made by the SVP to the Mini Vinnies to help them with any projects they had. With part of the money they chose and bought a colourful wooden crucifix for the main entrance for all children to see. The remainder of the money was used to buy prizes for a raffle. Almost £100 was raised and this was split between the charities MIND and Caritas Good Shepherd Appeal. Well done Mini Vinnies.

They are now in the process of planning activities for Lent.

Year 3 - First Forgiveness and First Holy Communion

Our children have already begun their sacramental journey, the Enrolment Mass took place on Sunday 25th January when all children were presented with a medal to wear at church.



Our Year 3 children will be going on retreat to St. Nicholas Catholic High School as part of their sacramental preparation and will be doing some exciting activities with their chaplain, Mairie.

Catholic Social Teaching

Catholic Social Teaching is rooted in scripture and formed by the teachings of the Church leaders. Simply put, it is our moral compass guiding us on how to live out our faith in the world. This term we will be focusing on the gospel values: Spring 1 – Promoting Peace Spring 2 – The Common Good.

Christmas Nativities and Carol Service

We celebrated the lead up to Christmas with some wonderful performances from all our children and we finished the year with a beautiful Carol Service to reflect on the true meaning of Christmas. Thank you for all your kind words, written feedback and donations. £274 was raised and will be donated to Caritas Good Shepherd Appeal and MIND to support them looking after others who are less fortunate. Mission Together - Reception Class Fundraiser


