

Focus on ... Year 1

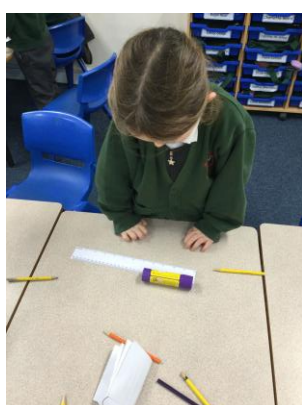
We have been very busy in Year 1 this half term!

In Science, we have been learning about different materials and their properties. We were also very lucky to have a visit from a materials scientist, who shared his expertise and helped bring our learning to life.

In Music, we have started learning some exciting songs with the music teachers from Love Music Trust. We are already beginning to prepare for our performance at Congleton Town Hall next half term, and the children are showing great enthusiasm and confidence.

In Maths, we have been learning how to measure using a ruler. The children have been practising measuring objects carefully and accurately, developing their understanding of length in a practical way.

Important - New Parent Portal – Arbor

Once you're signed in, you'll be able to update your child's information directly through the portal, including medical details, addresses, permissions, and more.

Unfortunately, due to the large number of outstanding payments in ParentPay, we were unable to shut down access to ParentPay today as planned. Balances already paid for residentials are being transferred to Arbor. We ask that any outstanding school meal debts in ParentPay are cleared as soon as possible. If your meal account is in credit, we aim to issue refunds by the start of the new half term.

As a little incentive, the first class to have all parents and carers logged on to Arbor will receive a treat from Miss Groarke.

We practised mark-making by writing Chinese numbers and even tried using chopsticks in our sensory play activities to develop our fine motor skills. To end our exciting week, we held our very own Dragon Parade! The children loved parading together, moving to music and celebrating all that we had learned.
