



Easter Garden Design & Technology Competition 2026



As part of our preparations for Easter, we are inviting all children to take part in a special Easter Garden Competition. This is a wonderful opportunity for families to reflect on the meaning of Jesus' resurrection while being creative together at home. Just as we display a Nativity scene at Christmas, an Easter Garden helps us remember the events of the first Easter morning. It represents the empty tomb of Jesus and the hope and new life that come from the Resurrection.

What is an Easter Garden?

An Easter Garden is a small model garden that represents the place where Jesus was laid in the tomb and rose again.

To make a Easter garden, you will need:

- A container (for example: a tray, box, plant pot, or dish) along with soil, sand, or moss to create the ground.

Your Easter Garden should include three important features:

- A mound with at least one cross to represent Calvary, where Jesus died.
- A stone or small stone structure to represent the empty tomb.
- Living greenery and flowers to symbolise new life, hope, and the Resurrection.

You are welcome to be as creative and thoughtful as you like. You may add small paths, pebbles, plants, or handmade figures to help tell the Easter story.

Important Information & Prizes

- Please bring your Easter Garden into school by Wednesday 1st April to be judged and displayed.
- There will be a prize for two winning gardens, one from Reception/KS1 and one from KS2
- Every child who takes part will receive a certificate.

We hope this activity will help our children reflect on the true meaning of Easter while enjoying a creative Design & Technology challenge with their families. We look forward to seeing your beautiful Easter Gardens!
