There are no passengers...




At Kelsall, our Crew culture will focus on;

- -enacting Crew culture all day, every day by everyone.


Our Behaviour Policy


As a school we use Conscious Discipline. The school website outlines this approach in detail.

















All Literacy and Connected Curriculum subjects will be taught through these books.

Year 2 other important things



- Children will have Mrs Hook Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, Mrs White Thursday and Friday and Mr Clayton on a Tuesday afternoon.
- Trips we will be planning lots of fun activities and trips for the class throughout the year

- KS1 SATS from this year, KS1 SATs are now non-statutory and optional. We may use the test materials to aid our teacher judgement but children will not be sitting these formally.

PE



Our PE day is Monday. This term we are focus on a range of fundamental movement skills.

PE Kit

- Children should come in to school in their PE kits on the PE day each week and will remain in them for the day, so please be mindful of the weather forecast.
- Most sessions will take place outside so they must be suitably dressed.
- White T'shirt and black bottoms are to be worn if possible.
- Please can you ensure your child has a coat with them in school during the week.
- Earings must be removed or covered with masking tape and long hair needs to be tied back.

Homework



READING

It is important that children read at home regularly. We encourage children to read at home at least 4 times a week. Children can choose books from school or read their own books at home.

In year 2, children will have a phonics book linked to the sound they are learning as well as another book which corresponds with their phonics colour band. As children progress through their phonics, they will move on to Accelerated Reader (AR).

AR is a programme we use to assess children's reading and insure children are reading books appropriate to both their age and reading level. When a child finishes a book, they will log on to AR to complete a quiz on this book.

Numbots

Maths – Half termly overview will be sent at start of each new term.
