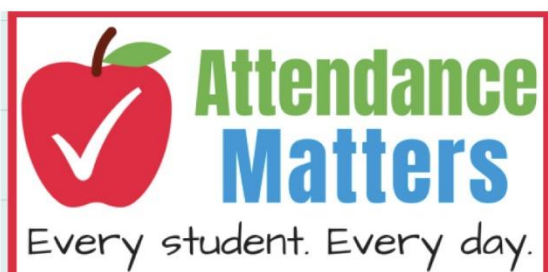

It has been wonderful to read so many positive comments, and we are delighted that parents continue to feel so supported by our school community. Many of you highlighted the high quality of teaching and the progress your children are making, as well as the fantastic range of sporting and musical opportunities on offer. We were also pleased to see such strong appreciation for our breakfast and after-school club provision, and for the regular communication you receive through Class Dojo. Most importantly, it was lovely to read how many parents noted just how happy their child is in school, something that means a great deal to us all.

We have also taken careful note of the suggestions for improvement and wanted to share our responses so far:

- **Gritting the school path** – This has now been actioned.
- **Replacement iPad for a child whose device was missing** – Actioned immediately.
- **More photos on Facebook to showcase the school day** – Miss L Pool is now our social media manager and will be sharing weekly highlights on a regular basis.

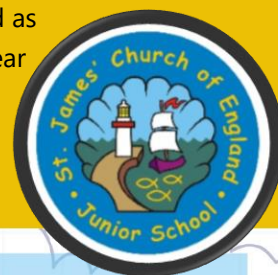
Sports Festival

Our children represented us admirably at the Change for Life festival at Whitehaven Academy, displaying fantastic teamwork and collaboration—especially the supportive, mentoring approach visible between Year 3 and Year 6. Throughout the week, many children have proudly visited the office to share their wonderful work, which has been a real highlight. In classrooms, learning has continued with great enthusiasm: Year 3 and 4 have been deepening their understanding of the different layers of a Rainforest, while Year 5 and 6 have been investigating how light travels in their practical science lessons, using excellent scientific vocabulary in both their predictions and conclusions.

Thank you to everyone for adjusting so smoothly to the new morning routine. As a reminder, children are welcome to play on the yard from 8:30am, when supervision begins, until the bell rings at 8:45am. 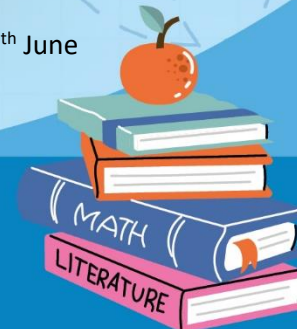
