The week began in a significant way with our Ofsted call, followed by inspectors spending Tuesday and Wednesday in school. During their visit, they reviewed safeguarding and behaviour records, observed a wide range of lessons, spoke with staff and pupils, looked closely at children's books, and spent time seeing playtimes and daily routines in action. We were joined by two inspectors alongside a shadow HMI. While we are not yet able to share the outcome until the final report is published, we expect this before the end of term. I would like to extend my sincere thanks to our children, staff and Governors, who have all represented the school so positively, both during the inspection itself and in the preparation leading up to it.

While this has been taking place, our Year 6 pupils have been enjoying a fantastic residential visit to Shropshire. Their itinerary has included visits to Chester Zoo, Shrewsbury Prison, Wroxeter Roman City, Alton Towers and The Snow Centre in Manchester, an incredible range of experiences. I am pleased to report that all has gone smoothly, and I am sure they will return this evening both happy and very tired! Back in school, Year 5 have taken part in a printmaking workshop, producing some excellent coastal scenes linked to our local area here in Whitehaven.
