It has been another busy and enriching week here at St James'. In Lower School, the children have continued their work inspired by *The Giant Arctic Jellyfish*, producing some wonderfully emotive letters and poetry that really capture the atmosphere and themes of the text. Their creativity has extended into Art, where they have been exploring the vibrant colours and textures of the rainforest, resulting in some striking and imaginative pieces. In Upper School, pupils have been using *High Rise Mystery* in English to develop their descriptive writing, focusing particularly on the use of figurative language to bring settings to life. In Science, the focus has been on classifying animals, with children developing a clear understanding of how living things can be grouped based on their characteristics.

Beyond the classroom, we have had many exciting opportunities for our pupils. More groups of Year 6 children have enjoyed their wild swimming experiences at Bassenthwaite Lake, showing great resilience and enthusiasm. A team of our footballers also represented the school brilliantly at a tournament in Carlisle today. Rehearsals are now well underway for our end-of-year production, *Super Stan* and the children are already showing great energy and commitment. Due to uncertainty around the Civic Hall reopening, we have secured an alternative venue at the Rosehill Theatre. As this venue has a much smaller capacity, this year the production will be limited to Year 6 pupils. The performance will take place on Thursday 9th July, with timings to be confirmed shortly once final arrangements are in place. Transport will be provided for all Year 6 children for both the rehearsal and performance days.
