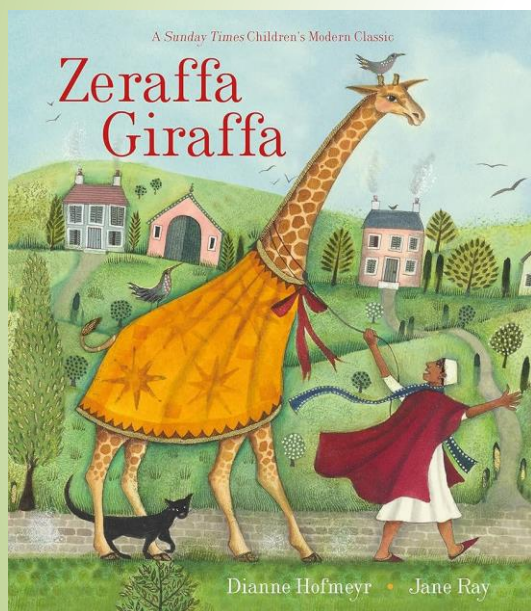


Summer 2 - Year 3

Communication, Language & Literacy Literacy

We will be reading *Zeraffa Giraffa* by Dianne Hofmeyr. We will be using it to design and write a persuasion leaflet.



French

Our topic this half term is called *Going on a picnic and where I live*. We will be learning about foods and places.

Problem Solving & Reasoning

Maths

In maths we will continue to look into fractions, including non unit fractions. We will then start to learn how to add and subtract fractions.

Then we will look at polygons and their properties before learning to tell them time to the nearest minute.

Creative Development

PE

This half term our outdoor PE topic is Cricket. We will be looking at throwing and catching including fielding, batting and bowling.

Music

Our music topic this half term is called *sing, play, notate*. Initially we will be listening and describing pitch and melody, before learning about different ways we can create graphic

Personal, Social & Emotional Development

PSHE

This half term we will be looking at our Economic Wellbeing. We will be learning about money habits, financial habits and budgeting. This will include looking at needs and wants.

RE

In RE we will be looking at the religion of Hinduism and considering the key question about why family is an important part of Hindu life?

Knowledge & Understanding of the World

Science

Our new science topic is Plants. We will be looking at the different parts of a plant, the lifecycles of plants and all things plants need to survive.

History

This term, we will be studying the Shang Dynasty of Ancient China. This will include artefacts, locations, events and where they feature on timelines.

Computing

This half term we will be learning all about uses of technology in society and their impact. We will also be learning the skills of advanced document creation.

DT

In DT we will be focussing on structures, designing and constructing a castle / palace using cardboard and even making and building some 3D shapes using a shape net.
