Summer Term Focus Theme and Focus Text:

Food, Teeth and Tummy Troubles!

Food, Teeth and Tummy Trouble explores the human body with a focus on teeth and digestion. Through the texts It Takes Guts by Jennifer Gardy and Smile! All About Teeth by Ben Hubbard, children learn how food is broken down and why dental care matters. In Science, they investigate tooth types and decay, and explore the journey of food through the digestive system. Writing outcomes include persuasive leaflets on dental hygiene, creative narratives from a food's perspective, explanation texts, and poetry. In Design and Technology, children create a fabric digestive system using sewing skills, making learning hands-on and memorable.

Our Curriculum:

Mathematics: This term we are focusing on fractions and decimals in particular equivalents of tenths and hundredths. They will consolidate their knowledge of the written methods, with a focus on problem solving. By the end of Year 4 it is an expectation that all children will know their multiplication tables to 12x12.

English: In English this term, the children will be reading 'Smile! All about teeth' and 'It takes guts' as our focus reading texts which is linked to their science topics. The children will develop a range of skills in reading, writing, grammar, punctuation and spelling. The children will write a persuasive leaflet about brushing teeth, a story about a piece of food's adventure through the digestive system and an explanation about the digestive system.

Religious Education: The children will deepen their understanding of Jesus, who he was, his teaching and behaviour. They will also further explore the story of David and read the Psalms to discover more about the nature of God.

Science: Teeth: The children will look at identifying different types of teeth and their functions in humans and animals. Digestion: The children will look at how food is transported around the body using scientific vocabulary.

Computing: Children will learn how to code using sentences instead of blocks, using 2Logo. They will learn how to code a sprite to move, to create patterns and use it to problem solve. Children will build upon their knowledge of animations using a variety of applications before ending the term by advancing their skills in music making using Busy Beats and Incredibox.

Music: The children will be continuing their Wider Opportunities journey on their violin / viola / cello. All instruments must be in school every Thursday. The children will be given the chance to perform in our Wider Opportunities Celebration concert (date tbc) and will be watching Wigan Schools' Gala Concert at Robin Park.

Topic: During this term, the children will be learning about the Anglo Saxons and Vikings. They will study the archaeological evidence at Sutton Hoo, the significance of St. Bede the Venerable and the legacy left behind by the Early Settlers.

Physical Education: This term, the children will be taking part in 'striking and fielding' games and outdoor adventurous activity.

Art and Design: The children will make their own 3D Anglo-Saxon mask like the mask discovered at Sutton Hoo.

Design and Technology: The children will focus on joining sewing stitches to create their own digestive system.

Relationships and Health Education (PSHE): In PSHE, we will be focusing on 'Mental Health' and 'Economic Wellbeing: Money'.

French:

This term, we will be focusing on numbers 13-31 and days of the week.

Home Learning

Spellings: Children will be given an age-appropriate spelling list and will be tested the following Monday.

Reading: In order to be competent readers, children need to read regularly at home and school. Parents/Carers are asked to encourage their children to read regularly and to read for pleasure. We ask parents/carers to sign and date Reading Records every time you hear your child read (we expect a minimum of four entries/comments a week). This is an ideal opportunity to question your child on their understanding of the text, to improve their comprehension skills and vocabulary. Reading Records must be brought into school on their allocated day, for teachers to sign and monitor. Children will be given opportunities to change their reading book every week.

Library (KS2 only): Children will have the opportunity to change their library book once a week. Year 4 library afternoon is Monday - Please ensure that your child brings their library book on this day if they wish to change it.

Maths (Year 1 to Year 6): Children will be given a weekly home learning task in Maths, to be given out every Friday, to consolidate the learning that has taken place in school during the week. This needs to be returned to their child's class teacher by the following Wednesday.

Multiplication Tables (Year 1 to Year 6): Children have got access to TT Rockstars, a maths programme focusing on multiplication tables link. Please encourage your child to use this online programme on a regular basis. If you do not know your child's username and password please contact helpdesk@saintwilfrids.wigan.sch.uk stating your child's full name and class.

Home Learning Project: Children will be set a Home Learning Project, related to their termly focus theme. This is usually a practical task, which families can work with children on together and share in school.

Additional Information:

Playground Equipment and Games: Children are not allowed to use any of the playground equipment or bring in balls to play with before or after school. Also, children are not permitted to use bikes or scooters on the school grounds. This is for health and safety reasons. Children must not enter the school car park or climb on the blue railings.

Parking: Please be reminded that parking on the school premises is for permit-holders only between 7am and 4.30pm.

Pets: Dogs are not permitted on the school grounds.

Attendance and Punctuality: Good attendance is crucial in your child's education. If your child is unwell and unable to attend school, please notify the office staff.

Medication: If your child requires medication such as inhalers, please ensure that your child's class teacher is provided with medication that is within its expiry date and is clearly labelled. You will be required to complete a medical form from the school office.

Long hair should be tied back using a bobble or hair-band in line with the colour of the school uniform (blue, navy, grey or black).

School Uniform: Please ensure that children wear the correct school uniform and look smart. Our school uniform consists of the following:

- Navy or dark grey school skirt/pinafore (knee length)
- Tailored dark grey, navy or black trousers (jogging bottoms optional in Nursery)
- Pale blue polo shirt
- Navy sweatshirt or cardigan
- Blue and white check dress (summer)
- Dark grey, navy or black tights
- Dark grey, navy, black or white socks
- Black school shoes (high-heeled shoes, boots or open-toe sandals are not permitted).

P.E. Uniform:

Children are expected to attend school in P.E. uniform on their P.E. day. This consists of the following:

- Sky-blue T-shirt
- Navy sweatshirt, cardigan or hoodie (no distinctive logos)
- Navy/black traditional P.E. shorts or navy/black leggings (not Nike Pro) or navy/black joggers
- Dark-coloured trainers (bright colours are not permitted).

Swimming: Children in Year 2 to Year 6 are expected to bring in swimming kit on their swimming day. Appropriate swimwear should be worn. Children with long hair are required to wear a swimming hat.

Earrings and Jewellery: Any form of jewellery is strongly discouraged and will only be permitted for religious or medical reasons (You will be required to request consent from school via email or letter). For Health and Safety reasons, under no circumstances, are earrings allowed to be worn in school.

Water bottles: Children are encouraged to drink water during the school day to keep them hydrated. They may bring in a plastic water bottle (not a 'Stanley-style' cup with straw), preferably clear, with their name labelled on it. They should take it home regularly to be washed. Children can refill bottles in school.

Snacks: Children may bring in a snack of either toast or a piece of fruit for morning playtime. Other items such as cakes, biscuits, crackers, sweets, cereal or fruit bars are not permitted at playtime. Please be aware that there are children in school with nut allergies. Therefore, can you please ensure that your child does not bring any items containing nuts into school as part of their packed lunch or snack. Please note that this may include some cereal bars.
