Transition into Year 1

This year we will be steadily introducing the Year 1 curriculum to the children, supported by the effective use of continuous provision.

Elements of Foundation Learning, such as some aspects of a play based curriculum will support us in achieving our key stage learning objectives, as we ease children into the increased expectations.

Each day basic skills will continue to be practised such as handwriting, writing of numbers and names, as well as, reading skills.

Phonics

Read Write Inc.

RWI sessions will be taught for 45 minutes each day.

Children will be taught in ability groups and the activities will be tailored to the children's needs.

Phonics Screening Check (Around June)

Reading

We will provide all children with a new named reading folder. These need to be brought in <u>daily</u> to support their learning.



- 1. Children will have a 'Book bag book'. This will link directly to the phonics they have learnt in school and will have familiar sounds for them to decode words mostly independently.
- 2. Children will also have a Phonics book. These books are ready daily with them in phonics. If your child doesn't bring this book in, they will not be able to use it in their phonics lesson to support their learning.
- 3. Children can have a reading for pleasure book. This is a story book that is not linked to their own reading abilities/phonic knowledge. It is a story for them to share with the family at home or enjoy on their own. They can swap these any day in school.

Reading

We will count the number of reads taken place over the week at home and progress will be displayed and celebrated in the classroom - there may also be the occasional prize!

Behaviour System



School Rules: Be Ready, Be respectful, Be safe

Rewards: Verbal praise, High Street Heroes, Work to be proud of/Wow wall, Dojo points

Reminder -> Warning -> Time out -> Reflection -> Repair

This gives children an opportunity to reflect on and change their behaviours.

We will continue to use ClassDojo this year. This is an app which allows us to reward positive behaviour which you can then see at home.

Indoor kits - blue t-shirt (or team colour), black shorts, pumps.


Outdoor - blue t-shirt (or team colour), tracksuit bottoms, jumper, trainers.
