 Separate waterproof coat, wellies/ walking shoes, t-shirt, jumper and waterproof trousers and coat


Healthy Eating

<u>Reading</u>

- Recommended at least 10 minutes every evening (home school book or reading for pleasure book).
- Questioning to develop comprehension skillsbook-band bookmarks will help to guide you on the questions to ask and things to discuss.
- Reading books are changed throughout the week on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.
- New Paper Diaries- please log reads at home.
 In school, children can log their own reads.
- Big push on reading for pleasure this year with our Year 4 Reading Challenge

<u>Homework</u>

- Homework books and spelling sheets given out every Friday. Expected back each Thursday.
- Multiple choice grid-children to choose at least 5 out of 9 activities to complete each half term. All children are expected to complete the homework at their level. We would prefer children to have a go rather than not complete any. This helps to prepare them for high school.
- Daily reading- please log reads
- Practise times tables regularly, ready for Multiplicatin Times Table Check in June. Every child will sit this.
- Practice on TTRS or counting games. Please ask your child's teacher for more support with this if needed.

Instead of a class winning the title of "Most Dojos" or individuals competing against one another for the most Dojos, this year, each class will set themselves an ambitious **target for the week** to work towards collectively. If they achieve it the class will receive a reward. This could be an extra playtime, blowing bubbles, watching a short cartoon, playing a game, colouring and drawing time, board games, dancing to some music-whatever the class vote for- within reason!

Behaviour: Our rewards



- The title of being a High Street Hero will replace the merit badge. Special stickers will be given out at the end of each week in class. There may be more than one child who achieves the title each week. A child could also win in consecutive weeks.
- If a child achieves 5 High Street Hero awards in a term, they will visit Mr Joule for a reward.

Behaviour: Consequences

- Reminder Verbal Warning Time out Reflection.
- An SLT member will lead reflection in the conference room. The children will attend reflection around their normal lunch time slot.
- Parents will be informed at the end of the day if their child has been to reflection, either by a conversation or a Dojo message.
- If a child attends reflection 3 times within a half term, a meeting between pupil, class teacher and headteacher will be held.
- If negative behaviour continues, there will be another meeting with parents.



Multiplication Tests

- Y4 children are now tested on their multiplication skills in the summer term. They will sit a test where they will answer 25 randomly generated times table questions which require answering in 6 seconds.
- By the end of the year, children should be able to recall all times tables up to 12 x 12
- We will work on multiplication skills during lessons, however children also need to practice their times tables at home.
- We encourage children to use Times Table Rock Stars or Hit the Button to practise their times tables.
