Dear Parents/Carers,

As we approach the half term break, the children have continued to excel in their lessons and build on their prior learning. It has been a pleasure to see them in their classes engaged in lesson and excited to learn.

## Head teacher Appointment

The staff and Governors have been busy following the recruitment procedures for the new Head Teacher. This week candidates for the position led a whole school assembly, met with groups of children, completed a series of desk top exercises to demonstrate their skills and met with groups of staff to explain their philosophy on education. The next stage of the procedure will be for the candidates to deliver a presentation on a given topic and then be interviewed by the Governors. This will be a rigorous process to find the most suitable person for the role. It is hoped that a final decision will be made soon and that we will then be able to notify you of who the successful applicant will be. I will then arrange for the new Head teacher to visit school during the coming months to undertake a comprehensive hand over and ensure a smooth transition.

## **World Book Day - Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> March 2026**

It's that time of year again, we are all getting super excited about celebrating World Book Day at High Street. Our dressing up theme this year will be to come to school '**Ready for a Bedtime Story**'. Please could you send your child with appropriate footwear (trainers, school shoes, etc) for playing outside in as slippers will be unsafe, especially if it rains.

## **Book Fair: Friday 6<sup>th</sup> March - Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> March 2026**

The Scholastic Book Fair will launch on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> March, straight after school, at 3:20pm. We will run the Book Fair on the Green Carpet area. On Monday 9<sup>th</sup> March, Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> March and Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> March, we will open the book fair in the mornings before school at 8:20am as well as after school at 3:15pm. Mrs Bueno-Ballantyne will be running the Book Fair with other additional staff to support.

Last year, we had a record amount of sales and were awarded with £270 commission from Scholastic, which was spent on updating the book banded books. Our aim this year is to beat our sales, hopefully even increase it, as our commission will be spent on new reading books for KS1 and LKS2.

There will be three ways to pay for your books on the day:

- Cash
- QR Code (you need your bank details to be able to pay this way)
- Apple Pay/Google Pay

Be sure to bring your World Book Day tokens with you to receive a discount. Scholastic have approved that these tokens do not need to be sent back to them once the purchase has been made. This means that you can use the voucher again in all major supermarkets and book shops.

# ATTENDANCE MATTERS



School begins 8.45am, and all pupils are expected to be in school for registration at that time.

- Register taken at 8.55am • Registers close at 9.15am

Any child who arrives after the gates are closed must enter the school by the main entrance and report to the school office to sign in. If pupils are not in class when the register is taken, they will be coded as 'L'. Any late arrivals after 9.15am will be coded as 'U' which is an unauthorised absence for that session. In accordance with the 'Education (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations 2006', if your child arrives after the registers close, they will receive a mark, code U, that shows them to be on site, but this will not count as a present mark, and it will mean they have an unauthorised absence. This may mean that you could face the possibility of a Fixed Penalty Notice or other legal action if the problem persists.

Children who are consistently late for school are disrupting not only their own education, but also that of other children. Where persistent lateness gives cause for concern, you will be invited to a meeting to resolve the issues. If there is no improvement following this meeting, further action will be taken which may include referral to external agencies.

You may approach the school at any time for support and advice if you are having difficulty getting your child to school on time or maintaining regular attendance

*As stated on the original letters, if you have consented to a residential visit and your child, no longer wishes to attend **we cannot refund deposits**. As with family holidays, we are required to start paying towards the visits well in advance and a change of mind does not allow us to claim the money back should a child decide not to attend. ## **School entrance/Late to school**

If you need to collect your child in the day for an appointment, or if you are late to school, please use the Verdin Exchange entrance only. We no longer use the previous entrance on the glass corridor. If children are late please can you ensure that you come in with them and sign in on the screen, thank you for your co-operation.

## **Calpol**

A reminder if your child needs Calpol please can we ask that you administer this before school and if they need a further dose, please bring a bottle to school in a named box/bag and complete a medication form.

We only have a very small supply of Calpol in the school office which is only for emergencies. If your child needs Calpol we will need to ring and ask you to bring it into school.

## **Medication**

Just a reminder that Office staff can **only** administer medicine which is prescribed by a doctor as four times a day. If you need us to administer medication, please complete a form in the Office.

## **HUB Before and After School club**

Just a reminder that all HUB clubs need to be prebooked in advance on the Arbor app to secure a place for each session for your child. Top ups can be made under the wraparound care section of the app.
