5 Fingers	1. Islam, 2. Muslims, 3. Qur'an, 4. Arabic, 5. Mosque
Allah	Allah is the Arabic word for God – whom Muslims worship,
Islam	The second most popular religion in the world.
Mohammad (pbuh)	The founder of Islam. Muslims say he is a messenger from God and is the last of the prophets.
Muslim	Someone who follows Islam. Muslims believe that there is only one God, Allah.
Wudu	The practice of washing before praying or reading from the Qur'an.
Qur'an	The Qur'an is a book in the Arabic language that Muslims believe to be the actual words of Allah.

Our End Points:

Emerging: I can tell you that we have been learning about a faith called Islam.

Expected: I can explain that the Qur'an is the sacred text for Muslims. I can tell you how Muslims use special words at the birth of a baby. I can explain that Muslims believe there is only one God called Allah and Muhammad (pbuh) was his messenger. I can show empathy and understanding about why their faith is important to Muslims.
