Community Safety Message From The Fire And Rescue Service

Some families may be considering purchasing, or may already have purchased, e-scooters or e-bikes for Christmas. Please see the following safety advice from Greater Manchester Fire and Rescue Service with parents and carers - <u>E-scooters</u>, e-bikes and batteries - <u>Greater Manchester Fire</u> Rescue Service

Key messages from the campaign are:

- Don't leave your device charging unattended or when you're asleep.
- Don't charge or store your battery in the hallway, communal area or where it could block your escape.
- Only use the correct charger for your battery.
- Only buy e-bikes, e-scooters, mobility scooters and batteries from trusted retailers and manufacturers.
- Always follow the manufacturer's instructions. Don't attempt to modify or tamper with the battery.
- Check for the CE or UKCA safety marking to make sure your battery and charger meet safety standards.
- It is recommended that a professional carries out an e-bike conversion. Never put batteries in household bins. Recycle them safely at your local tip
