
ANCORA, CASTLE PARK NEWSLETTER

WORK EXPERIENCE

A group of our Year 11 students are taking part in a weekly Reading Partner Project at a local primary school we are linked with in Frodsham. The students have made a fantastic start, getting to know their Year 3 reading partners, designing bookmarks and listening to them read. This opportunity helps to boost confidence, develop transferrable skills and explore settings in the context of a work placement. One of our students shared "it's a fun experience and I'm learning how to explain things clearly to the pupils."



ENGLISH

It has been a busy first term for the students. KS3 have been studying the novel, Refugee Boy and examining issues raised in the text through language analysis and creative writing. KS4 have been completing their Speaking and Listening Assessments, with an eclectic mix of topics. It is really intimidating imparting formal information to peers, but the young people worked particularly hard and delivered their topic's with confidence and knowledge. Language Paper 1 has been a key focus of study, with the students practising exam technique for questions 1-4 and learning how to effectively plan for question 5- a written narrative or description based on an image or title. Students studying Literature have focused on A Christmas Carol, Macbeth and Poetry, this term. Students enjoy exploring contextual elements and delight in the ross-curricular knowledge they can exhibit n this, from History, to Art and Geography. Next term, KS4 students have a pre-recorded version of A Christmas Carol and Macbeth to atch, with KS3 participating in a live Zoom with author, Katherine Rundell!

across the web, forums and video sharing




