Please keep level books and Reading Records in your school bag. Bring them to school each day so you have it ready for your reading session.

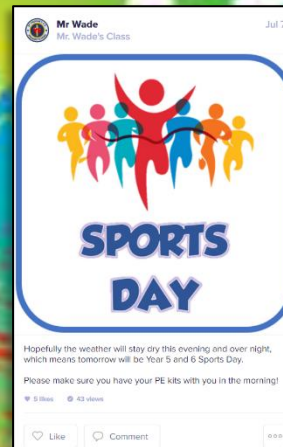
All Reading Records will be checked in school on a Thursday morning for Mrs Blackledge's Reading Owls competition so please make sure you have it with you!

CLASS DOJO



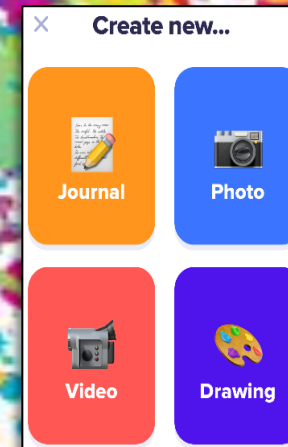
Keep in touch

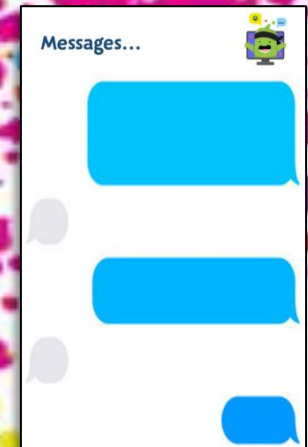

DOJO ISLANDS



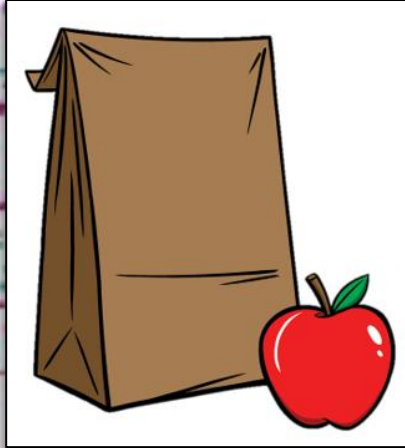
Interact with your friends
