Behaviour




- High expectations

- Practise the BASICS including addition and subtraction
- Multiplication tables and division facts
- Pupils should know all multiplication tables and be able to recall them rapidly
- Number strategies
- Problem solving
- Quick mental recall encourage the daily use of Numbots and TT Rockstars
