

Welcome to Year 1

Routines – School Day

The gate opens each morning at 8:40am and classroom doors open at 8:45am. Registration closes at 8:50am and learning begins immediately.

If somebody different than usual is picking up your child, then please send a message via School Spider or let the office/member of staff know.

Pick-up is at 3.20 at the door allocated.

If your child is unwell and will be absent, please ring the school office as soon as you can – 01744 678343 or send an absent note via School Spider.

Staff in Year 1 are Mrs Saphier and Miss Bennett .

Expectations

- Our school rules are READY, RESPECTFUL and SAFE. Children are expected to follow these expectations at all times in school.
- Children can earn house points for following school expectations including good work, manners, working as a team etc.
- Star of the Week certificates are given out during a Monday assembly alongside any mentions in each class 'Golden Book'.
- For those children needing a sanction, we follow the school behaviour policy. Children receive a verbal warning, then up to 2 recorded warnings before having time out inside the classroom. If behaviours are repeated, children will be spoken to by Mrs Speed.



Uniform

- Uniform can be ordered online and collected from the school
- Red sweatshirt or cardigan (optional school logo)
- Grey trousers/skirt/pinafore
- White polo shirt (optional school logo)
- Sensible black school shoes
- Grey shorts/red and white gingham dress (Summer).
- Sensible coat – ideally with a hood
- Book bag (to fit in classroom tray) – limit keyrings
- PE kits consisting of plain black tracksuit/red shorts, white t-shirt & pumps/trainers.
- No nail varnish/false nails and only stud earrings are permitted
- Please ensure all uniform is clearly labelled.
- No additional items should be brought into school e.g. pencils, felt tips, squishes, fidgets etc.

Healthy School

- Water bottles with a sports cap – water only.
- We aim to be a healthy school, so please send water bottles in every day. Milk and fruit is available every day at break time. If you would like to send in a different piece of fruit for break time, please put this separately in your child's bag.
- Milk is paid for through school money and is £12.16 per half term.
- If your child has a packed lunch, we ask you not to provide fizzy drinks, sweets or chocolate bars. It is our policy to ask children to take home any uneaten food in their lunch box so that you will be aware of how much has been eaten.
- If your child eats a hot dinner, please make sure all choices are made via School Grid each morning before 9am.
- There are children within school who have nut allergies, please do not send anything in containing nuts, including chocolate spreads.

Reading Books

- In KSI we have three different books that are sent home.
- **Reading for Pleasure books** — these are sent home on Monday and returned on Friday. These are books that are to be shared as a family, at bedtime, before tea or just snuggled up on the sofa.
- **RWI books** — these are sent home on Monday and returned on Friday. These are phonetically plausible books that are chosen specific in line with your child's phonic knowledge.
- **Phonetically decodable or banded reading books** — these are changed every Tuesday and Friday. Don't worry about reading a full book each day, reading a couple of pages each day will be great. Please just make a note of which page you have read up to via Pageticker.
- RWI books and banded reading books will only be swapped if they have been read and it has been recorded via Pageticker.

Reading Expectations

- Children should ideally read at least 3 times a week at home. For those children consistently reading at home there will be additional celebrations in school.
- Please log your child's reading via the Pageticker app. This is shared and celebrated within the classroom.
- This could be any of the books that are sent home from school or sometimes books of your own/from the library.

PE

- PE for this half term is on Monday and Wednesday .
- These days are subject to change each half term and you will be notified via School Spider.
- Please ensure your child comes to school in the appropriate kit on the appropriate day.
- Any child with long hair, should have it tied back for PE.
- Any ear piercings will be covered with tape for safety reasons.
- Football kits are not permitted.

Communication

- Staff may send messages via School Spider app, please ensure your details are up to date and you can access the app.
- If you have any messages for the teacher, please send via School Spider.
- Passwords for homework will be put in your child's reading book folder. These passwords will be needed throughout the year.
- If you have any difficulties logging on, please let the office know and they will be able to sort this out for you.

Homework

- Reading is an essential part of our homework in Year 1. We ask that you try to read daily with your child and make a note of this via Pageticker.
- In addition to reading daily, we have Rainbow Challenges for KSI. These are challenges set for each half term. The first RED Rainbow Challenge has six different activities for your child to complete before October half term. Please take pictures of your child completing each activity and add it onto School Spider (Rainbow Challenges Red Autumn 1). If they have completed at least four of these challenges before October half term, they will earn their Red Rainbow Certificate.
