

Homework at Norwood

Homework is a statutory requirement for schools. We fully appreciate that this can be a stressful time for parents at home, especially if you have more than one child or work long hours.

All children will be given an exercise book and the work to be completed will be shared via Dojo each week.

For ALL children in KS 1 and 2, homework is given out on a **THURSDAY**, to be returned on the **TUESDAY**.

Here are some top tips to make homework an easier experience:

- 1. Try to create a homework routine. E.g. Same time and place each week.
- 2. Switch off all distractions.
- 3. Try to do a little bit each day, so it does not become an overwhelming process.
- 4. Allow the children to be as independent as possible, even if this is just for short periods of time.
- 5. It is okay for the children to get things wrong. It is a life skill and it is great that the children learn from making their own mistakes.
