


Norwood Year 3 must reads.


The Magic Faraway Tree By Enid Blyton

Five on a Treasure Island By Enid Blyton






<u>Guinea Pig Superstar</u> By Ali Pye


Yet when it turns out that Fergus has also brought in his pet - a corn snake - the day turns out to have some unexpected results.

Poor Duncan just wants to colour in. But when he opens his box of crayons, he only finds letters, all saying the same thing: We


The Day the crayons came home. By Oliver Jeffers
