

You will come through these gates at the front of the school.








You will then enter this door next to RECEPTION Classes.


Once you come in, you walk up the nearest staircase and head straight to your cloakroom.

Then come into class and complete the activity that is on the board. This could be a 4 ADAY or HANDWRITING TASK.






Next we begin our ENGLISH lessons. Here we will learn grammar, spellings, write and read. We start with a really exciting book...

Next in Year 4, we like to do Reading. In Reading, we like to separate you into different groups across the Year group. It might not be your class teacher teaching you Reading. It could be Mrs Harris, Mrs Bryant, Miss Clark, Mrs Howard, Miss Lloyd, Mrs Harrison or Mrs Bradshaw.

In Reading, we learn how to read through texts carefully, discuss vocabulary and answer questions using different skills.

Next, is Maths. In Maths we normally start our learning thinking about PLACE VALUE.

We then move onto ADDING, SUBTRACTING, MULTIPLYING and DIVIDING.

Do you know how to do these? Let's give it a go now!

$$44 + 23 = 89 - 45 = 25 \div 5 = 4 \times 5 =$$



LUNCH TIME

Year 4 normally go out to eat first at lunch time. After we eat, we play on the big yard, near the MUGA. Sometimes this changes so it could be different in September.

We must remember to follow the lunch time rules. Go into the hall and sit at your table. Only eat when everyone has lunch and remain seated until an adult tells you otherwise.

If it is wet play, we will remain in our classrooms to the hall for our lunch.



In the afternoons, we cover lots of different subjects. Can you guess what they might be?














Did you get any right? In Year 4, different teachers teach different subjects.



Metacognition is like being a brain superhero! It means knowing how and when to use our superpowers in order to think and learn.




