TASTER VISITS

We are offering visits for the children to attend on Tuesday 5th July or Wednesday 6th July

Between 3-4pm

The date of your child's visit is included in your information pack that you should have received.

The children will have the opportunity to play in their classroom and meet their teacher and teaching assistant, as well as some of their new friends.

Parents do not stay at these visits, as we would like to start getting to know your children.

If you really cannot attend on the date of your visit but could attend the alternate date, please let us know and we'll see what we can do.

KEY INFORMATION

- Children begin part-time on Thursday 8th September.
- Morning part-time sessions are 8.30am-11.00am.
- Afternoon part-time sessions are 12.00pm-2.30pm.
- Children begin full-time on Monday 19th September 8.30am –
 2.30pm
- During their part-time days they DO NOT have their lunch at school, they will receive a snack.
- On Monday 5th, Tuesday 6th and Wednesday 7th we will be inviting parents and children into school for an initial parents meeting for 30 minutes each.
- In your pack your appointment time and date is confirmed, based on the information you returned to us in May.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

- We have changed the uniform for our Reception children, to suit the activities that our Early Years children complete every day.
- Boys uniform will be: white polo shirt, navy school sweatshirt, navy jogging bottoms and navy/black trainers. (every item should be named). In the summer, navy shorts may be worn.
- Girls uniform will be: white polo shirt, navy school sweatshirt/cardigan, navy jogging bottoms/leggings and navy/black trainers. (every item should be named) In the summer nay shorts may be worn.
- All trainers should be Velcro fastenings, no laces please.
- Reception children also require Wellington Boots and waterproofs (either trousers and a jacket, or an all- in -one romper style suit). These should all be named and in a bag with your child's name on too. The waterproofs will stay in school, as we access outdoor play every day. In this bag, please put some spare underwear and socks, in case of any accidents.

SCHOOL MEALS

ALL children in Reception have school meals for their lunch, NO packed lunches.

There are two hot choices every day (at least one choice is vegetarian), there are also sandwiches and jacket- potatoes available every day.

All dietary requirements can be catered for, but you will need to discuss this with your class teacher at your parents meeting.

We try to encourage the children to choose one of the hot choices, but if they really don't like either choice, they can choose a sandwich or jacket- potato.

We have had great success with even the fussiest eaters, encouraging them to try new things and expanding their diets.

It is AMAZING what children will try when they see their friends eating it!

HOW CAN I HELP MY CHILD BE READY FOR SCHOOL?

- The most important skills to teach your child to aid their readiness for school, are their self-help skills.
- Are they fully toilet trained (including wiping their own bottoms)? Our toilets are not located directly off our classrooms, they are at the end of our corridor. Children access these toilets independently. We do not send a member of staff every time a child goes to the toilet, and we do not check that a child has cleaned themselves properly every time they visit the toilet. Of course, if any child has an accident, we will assist them in cleaning and getting changed. However, unless there is a diagnosed medical condition, we would expect all children to be able to use the toilets independently.
- Can they put on their own coats and shoes? In a class of 30 children, it can take a long time to get outside if the staff have to put on everybody's coat and Wellington Boots. These are skills easily practised at home.

HOW CAN I HELP MY CHILD BE READY FOR SCHOOL? (CONTINUED)

- Encourage your child to pack their own reading bag for school, including reading books and any letters. At the end of the school day when we are giving items out, we encourage all children to put their things into their bags.
- Does your child recognise their own name? In school they will need to be able to find their own coat pegs, their own books, their own pencil pots and their own clothing with their name on. We do use photographs as well, but being able to recognise their name gives them lots of confidence.
- Can they use a knife, fork and spoon? Can they drink from an open cup? At lunchtime we do have staff to assist the children in cutting up their food, but they have 90 children to support. The more independent the children can be, the better. Sitting down together for your meals, as a family, is a lovely way to prepare your child for their school lunches.

HOW CAN I HELP MY CHILD BE READY FOR SCHOOL (CONTINUED)

- Do you have a set bedtime routine? Getting the children into good habits at bedtime can be crucial for their success at school. Well rested children make better progress and can cope with the business of the school day much better. Try to stick to the same routine every night. School age children should be sleeping in their own beds for the entire night. If your child still tries to get in your bed with you, this should be discouraged to ensure that everyone is getting a good night's sleep! This could be something you work on over the summer if this is still happening in your home.
- Does your child still use a dummy, bottle or push-chair? The extended use of dummies and bottles can have detrimental effects on a child's speech development. School age children should NOT be using either. The extended use of a push-chair can also affect a child's gross motor development. School age children should be encouraged to walk whenever possible, unless there is a diagnosed medical condition.

- Our classes are put together using information shared from pre-schools and parents. We try to ensure that they have at least one familiar face from their pre-school if we can. We also ensure that there is a fair mix of genders and birthdays across all 3 classes. Even if your child has not been placed with someone that you would have really liked them to be with, we promise that they will make new friends very quickly!
- You will all have an opportunity to meet with your class teachers and teaching assistants at your parents meeting in September.
