


Norwood Year 2 must reads.



The Adventures of Captain Underpants By Dav Pilkey





The Big Book of the UK By Imogen Russell




Introduce children to the wonders, history, culture and customs of the United Kingdom with *The Big Book of the UK*!

The Diary of a Killer Cat By Anne Fine





"Aliens love underpants, in every shape and size.


But there are no underpants in space, so here's a big surprise...."

Shark in the Park By Nick Sharratt






The Hodgeheg By Dick King Smith
