Please find information listed about the curriculum which will be taught throughout this half term.

| Subject   | Topic this half term   | Additional notes   |

| English   | Reading This half term we will be continuing the new, 'Pathways to Reading' scheme, where the children will spend 30 minutes a day on reading skills. The book we are using is titled, 'The Place for me' by Floella Benjamin. The children will also continue to use computer programmes called Learning by Questions and Sat's Companion to further develop comprehension skills.  Writing Our English topics this half are, an adventure story, a piece of descriptive writing and a diary entry based on a visit to an attic and a biography.  We will be building on the skills taught in previous years, as well and applying these to more detailed pieces of writing.  Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (S.P.A.G) We will be revising elements taught from Y3, Y4 and Y5 during this half term. | Reading Reading is so important throughout school and we ask you to read 3 times a week for 20 minutes. Please make a note in their reading record to show your child has read 3 times. Reading records are checked on a Thursday  Spellings Spellings Spelling sheets are given out each Thursday and the completed sheets are to be returned by the following Thursday. There will be a spelling test on that day. Scores will be added to homework books which should be returned to school on a Thursday.  Visit to Octagon Theatre to see Christmas Carol |
| Maths     | This half our focus is fractions, decimals, percentages, measures and a revision of shape. We mainly follow the White Rose Scheme for Maths but also use a number of computer programmes to aid our learning. The main one we use is Learning by Questions.  | Maths at home  All children will soon be given a log in for the 'Sat's Companion Website.' This is a great resource to support our maths learning. Homework is set weekly and there are videos available with the homework to aid the learning.  |
| R.E       | Our focus this half term is 'Why do Christians believe that Jesus was the Messiah?' Vocabulary is based on the New Testament noting the beliefs that Christians hold about Jesus.  | Remembrance Day and The<br>Carol Service will be our 2 visits to<br>St Andrew's Church this term.  |
| Computing | In computing we will be looking at Micro-bit coding and playing games such as 'Love Metre. 'Vocabulary used will include such terms as: loop, conditional variables, input and output  |  |
| Science   | The topic studied this half term will be 'Light.' The children will recognise that light appears to travel in straight lines and explain that we see things because light travels from light sources.  |  |
| PSHE      | This half term our focus is – Recognising and celebrating difference. We will be discussing prejudice-based bullying and how this can be combatted.  |  |

| Technology | Our topic this half term will be Digital World. The children will look at how to design and develop a product  |  |
