


We would also like to thank our former pupils who came along to help. It was great to see you all and to have your support.




Attendance

Overall Attendance this week is 95.51%

Across the school, **200 minutes** of learning time was lost this week through late arrivals.

Don't underestimate the importance of 100% attendance. Even one day missed can have an effect on learning.

98% attendance means 4 school days missed
95% attendance means 10 school days missed
90% attendance means 19 school days missed
80% attendance means 38 school days missed
5 minutes late each day means 3 school days missed

St Mary's Class

Frodsham Walk

St. Mary class has had a lovely time on our geography fieldtrip around Frodsham this week. We braved the weather and followed the map to Castle Park and back. We have done lots of follow up geography work as a result of this trip including tracing our route on the map, sorting what we saw into groups of people who help us, shops and leisure and we have used Purple Mash to create a graph that shows what we saw the most of.

English

This week we have been reading a new book for a "mini" unit Meesha Makes Friends. We have written lots of diary entries about how she feels and we learned about how he "made" friends (using boxes and glue, and how this helped her to make (real life) friends.

Maths

Year 1 and 2 have continued to work hard with fluency and recalling number facts, in particular with times tables and number bonds to 10. Please keep practicing these at home with their new fluency cards. Year 1 have been working with fact families to write different number sentences and year 2 have been adding 3 single digit numbers.

Science

In science we have been designing and carrying out our own investigations. Year 1 and 2 predicted which material would be best to keep penguin dry during his trip across the ocean and Reception have been exploring magnets and investigating which materials are magnetic.

We have worked extremely hard this term and it is hard to believe that this is only reception's first half term! They have settled into school life very well and we are very proud of all of St. Mary class! Have a lovely half term break.





St Elizabeth's Class





This week in Maths, Year 3 have been learning how to use column addition to add three-digit numbers. We learnt that this was the most efficient method, and the skills from this week will help us after half term when we learn how to make an exchange. In Year 4, we have been working out how to make more than one exchange with four-digit numbers. It has been challenging but we used our value of resilience to help us.

In English, we have been looking at a new book this week linked to our Black Lives Unit. The book is called 'Coming to England' written by Floella Benjamin, and it tells the story of a young Floella and her journey to England. We have investigated some model letters written in an informal style, and looked closely at some of their features. We are working towards writing our own letters imaging we are Floella.

In Science this week, we have moved on to the water cycle and we used actions to learn some of our key words: evaporation, condensation and precipitation. We also made water cycles in bags and taped them to the windows to discover what happens when condensation builds up over the week!

In History, we studied oracle bones and learnt about how people in the Shang Dynasty would use these to answer key questions. We had a go at deciphering some symbols to uncover hidden messages, and then tried writing our own!

At the start of the week, both classes took part in an Online Safety workshop. Year 3 learnt about how to create safe passwords and not to share them with other people! They also had the chance to go on the VR headsets which they thoroughly enjoyed! Year 4 were looking at 'fake news' and the ease in which people can create stories that are not true. They had good fun inventing their own fake news headlines.

In computing, we worked hard to do some online coding and create a scene where our characters and animals could move and make noises. We used a flowchart to help us determine the action our characters should make.

St Catherine's Class



The final week before the half-term break has been another busy and exciting one! We started the week by planning our hot tasks in English. Over the past few weeks, we have been building up to this point, learning new skills and developing our writing techniques. This week, we were finally able to put everything we have learned into practice. Everyone worked hard on their hot tasks, and we are incredibly proud of the writing we have produced—using a range of grammatical features to enhance our work and make it cohesive.

In science, we have been planning an investigation to test Charles Darwin's hypothesis about natural selection. We created detailed plans that identified the different variables and carefully considered what to measure and how to ensure that the test would be fair. We are looking forward to conducting our investigations after the half-term break and discovering what our results will show.

We all really enjoyed our geography lessons this week. Year 5 pupils explored renewable energy sources, researching the benefits and drawbacks of different types of energy, while Year 6 focused on global trading routes and how goods move around the world. Both year groups demonstrated fantastic map-reading and research skills throughout their studies.

Alongside our lessons, we were fortunate to welcome a special visitor to school. Mr Strickland, from Digital Wizards, led an interactive workshop on online safety. He spoke to us about the importance of keeping personal information private, thinking carefully before sharing anything online, and knowing what to do if we ever feel unsure or uncomfortable when using the internet. It was an important reminder of how to stay safe in our increasingly digital world.
