
Attendance

St Mary's Class

English

This week we have been writing about Nibbles and what he has been up to. We have written some diary entries from the point of view of different characters and have been learning about commas in lists and using -ly for adverbs (Year 2), using capital letters for names and places (Year 1) and writing cvc words and forming letters correctly (EYFS)

Maths

We have introduced shape this week and have been recapping different 2D and 3D shapes and their properties. We have been noticing different shapes around our classroom and talking about vertices and faces.

Vine and Branches

In our Golden Box this week we had a figure of Mary and Elizabeth and we learned about Mary visiting her cousin who was also having a baby.

Nativity

We enjoyed starting our rehearsals this week and they are going well. Thank you very much for all of you support with learning lines.

Personal Development

We have finished out second unit of My Happy Mind and we enjoyed reading the story Going to the Volcano. We talked about ensuring that everyone can join in and not leaving anyone out.







St Elizabeth's Class



This week in Maths, Year 3 have been finishing their topic of addition and subtraction by using the inverse operation to check our strategies. We also used estimation to work out our answers roughly. We found it tricky but we persevered! Year 4 have been enjoying a new topic of area, and have progressed to learning about how multiplication facts can help us to calculate area more quickly.

In English, we have started applying our mastery keys this half term to our writing. Year 4 have been working on using and correcting standard English, and the whole class have been looking at using different conjunctions to improve our sentences and extend them.

In the Vine and Branches this week, we have thought about what happens at mass, particularly during the liturgy of the word and taking communion. We have discussed different key words and made leaflets to help younger children understand what happens.

In Geography this week, we made some model rivers in small groups to better understand their structure and features. We used a variety of materials including card, egg boxes, yoghurt pots and tin foil to represent different terrain. The groups joined together to explain key concepts to one another.

On Wednesday we were very lucky to have a whole-day workshop making lanterns for the Frodsham Christmas Festival next week! We used our D&T skills to consider different structures and strengths. We discovered that triangles were strong shapes, and that making these into diamonds made them even stronger. We built our structures out of wooden rods, before covering them with teabag paper and sparkles. We are really excited to use these next week!



St Catherine's Class



We've had a very busy and productive week in class, with learning linking together in lots of meaningful ways.

We began the week by taking on some challenging maths units. Year 5 continued developing their skills in multiplication, while Year 6 focused on long division and the order of operations. Both year groups showed impressive resilience throughout, and it was fantastic to see their confidence grow as they applied their learning to a wide range of fluency questions.

Our new English text, Can We Save the Tiger?, connected well with our wider theme of responsibility and staying safe. To introduce the topic, we watched a powerful video clip highlighting the impact of poaching on tiger populations. This immediately captured our interest and led to some excellent research, where we discovered many fascinating facts about tigers and the threats they face.

In The Vine and The Branches, we continued to build on these ideas by exploring the theological virtues and discussing how we can live them out in our everyday lives. Everyone contributed thoughtful examples and confidently linked their ideas to scripture, showing maturity in their reflections.

Our final swimming session this week focused on water safety, reinforcing the importance of keeping ourselves and others safe. We learned how to call for help in an emergency and talked about the safest ways to assist someone who may be struggling in the water.

This theme of safety carried through to the end of the week, when we took part in an important NSPCC workshop. The session shared clear messages about how to stay safe and reminded us of what to do, and who to talk to, if we ever feel worried about something.

What a busy sport week!

A team of year 4 and 5 children represented our school in a Small Schools Football competition in Ellesmere Port and gave it 100%! We were so proud of their effort, resilience and teamwork. We also had 2 children represent school as Change4Life Champions, also in Ellesmere Port, and they had a great time learning about healthy eating, exercise and what it does to the body. They will now be introducing what they have learned with the School. Thank you so much to our staff and volunteer parent helpers who make these events possible.
