
Attendance

98%attendance means 4 school days missed

80% attendance means 38 school days missed

History

We are looking forward to our upcoming Weaverhall Museum visit and we have been enjoying learning about schools from the past. The children would quite like a coal fire in our classroom but were Not impressed by the idea of using a cane or a dunce hat!



We have been talking about Mary our Mother in Heaven this week and how special she is. We learned the Hail Mary prayer and discussed what each line means, then we drew pictures to help us remember.

Computing

We have been giving a program instructions this week by choosing text and Images in the correct order. We then created our own by creating a recipe for Chocolate Rice Crispy cakes.



NSPCC

We were lucky enough to take part in an NSPCC workshop this week and watching a special online assembly where we learned about how to keep ourselves safe and to speak out if someone if not safe.

Nativity

Rehearsals are well under way and the children have been very excited to try on their costumes. Letters have gone out to some children who need a few extra items that you hopefully already have at home. If you have any problems with these items please let me know. Next week we will be practicing without scripts so please can children keep practicing their lines.

Reading

We have see a sharp decline in the number of children who are reading regularly at home. This is having an impact on learning progress. Please ensure that your child is reading at least 3 times a week and discussing the book, answering questions that include who, what, when, why.



St Elizabeth's Class



This week, St Elizabeth class have been working hard during assessment week! We have been putting out maths, reading and spelling knowledge to the test and have worked extremely hard, persevering even when things were tough.

In Maths, Year 3 have started a new topic of multiplication and division. We also enjoyed launching our times table flashcards game with partners and have been competing for different coloured cards! Year 4 have completed their topic of area and will move on to multiplication and division next week.

In English, we have carried on reading our book, 'Leon and the Place Between,' and have been considering the literary devices used to build suspense including short sentences and the use of ellipsis.

In Science, we have been learning about our three types of teeth and their uses. We enjoyed building a labelled model of our mouths to consolidate our learning.

In the Vine and Branches, we compared the accounts of the prophet Isaiah and Luke when they spoke about the angel Gabriel's message about Jesus. We compared language and meaning, and then created some artwork to depict our own interpretation of what it could have looked like.



St Catherine's Class



It's been another busy week in St. Catherine's Class; Tuesday stood out as an especially busy day. Year 5 took part in a very important workshop delivered by Cheshire Fire Service, all about keeping safe in our homes. It certainly made us think—have you checked your smoke detector this week? Meanwhile, Year 6 represented the school brilliantly at a "Big Maths" workshop delivered by the University of Liverpool at Helsby High School. They demonstrated excellent teamwork and resilience as they tackled a range of problems and puzzles, supporting one another and celebrating each success.

Later in the week, our geography lesson continued this theme of curiosity and discovery. We explored how energy use has changed over time and compared our findings with data from the USA. The children were fascinated by the differences and quickly engaged in thoughtful discussions about what these comparisons might mean for the future.

In English, we have been enjoying our work linked to our key text 'Can We Save the Tiger?'. This week, we focused on using parenthesis to enhance our writing, it was great to see how the class confidently used this skill to add detail, clarity, and interest to their sentences.

To round off our week, a team of Year 5 and 6 children attended a Tag Rugby event on Thursday alongside other local primary schools. They demonstrated determination, teamwork, and sportsmanship throughout the competition - well done to all involved.
