We thoroughly enjoyed the pantomime at the Story house this week - especially joining in with the songs. The year 6 children looked after their buddies very well and everyone represented our school well.

History

We have been writing about whether we would like to be a child in a school 100 years ago or now. There are some things we enjoyed, like having a fire in the classroom and using the slate boards but we decided we much prefer our school now.

Purple Mash

We have been exploring Christmas using our computing programme Purple Mash. We were creating wreaths, Christmas jumpers and even a hot chocolate with marshmallows for Mrs Jevons! We also recreated the Nativity Tableau using images.





Reading

We have see a sharp decline in the number of children who are reading regularly at home. This is having an impact on learning progress. Please ensure that your child is reading at least 3 times a week and discussing the book, answering questions that include who, what, when, why.

St Elizabeth's Class



This week in St Elizabeth class we have continued our topic of multiplication and division. Year 3 have been looking at the 4s, and year 4s have been exploring the relationship between the 3s, 6s and 9s.

In English, we are nearing the end of our topic. We read to the end of our topic book and finally discovered what was in 'the place between!' We have started our hot task planning and will be writing a diary entry to recount Leon's adventure. On Fluency Friday, we explored the difference between common nouns and proper nouns and did some Christmas writing to solidify our learning.

In the Vine and Branches we explored how Joseph had to trust God when the Angel Gabriel appeared with his message. We also explored from Mary's point of view and considered their thoughts and feelings at the time. We talked about how Joseph's trust can inspire our own faith in God.

In D&T, we reflected on our castle designs from last lesson and discussed which ones would be easy or difficult to make based on their shapes and the available materials. We worked on building castles with basic 3D shapes including cubes, cuboids, cones and pyramids. We then re-designed our castles being mindful of the complexity.

Earlier in the week, we were lucky to watch Beauty and the Beast at the Chester Storyhouse. We were fantastic representatives of our school and enjoyed the performance very much! We have also been busily rehearsing for our Carols by Candlelight concert on Monday, and we can't wait to show all of the parents how hard we've been working.



St Catherine's Class



Another busy and exciting week has flown by as we move closer to the festive season. In Maths, both year groups have shown great determination. Year 5 have been working hard to understand square and cube numbers, while Year 6 have been developing their confidence in adding and subtracting fractions. We explored what to do when denominators are different and how to approach these problems systematically, and it has been wonderful to see everyone striving to master these skills.

Our learning in The Vine and the Branches has also been thoughtful and engaging. This week, we explored the story of King David, making meaningful links to our earlier work on Moses. The class were able to share thoughtful responses about why they think David was chosen by God, showing how their understanding is deepening over time.

In Art, we continued to develop our sketching skills by learning how to use one-point perspective. Although this new technique felt challenging initially, everyone showed great perseverance. Their confidence grew as the week went on, and they were really proud of their work.

Our reading lessons brought an excitement to the classroom as we explored extracts from books by Frank Cottrell Boyce. His writing captured everyone's imagination, and it was lovely to see so many eager to seek out his books in the library after enjoying the samples together.

A highlight of the week was our visit to the Storyhouse in Chester to watch the pantomime Beauty and the Beast. The performance was great and Year 6 particularly enjoyed sharing the experience with their buddies. The whole group joined in the sing-alongs, making it a memorable and enjoyable trip.

As we approach the final week before the Christmas break, our focus is turning to the upcoming Carols by Candle-light service. The children have been rehearsing and preparing for this special retelling of the Christmas story. We hope you will join us on Monday evening as we come together to celebrate the true meaning of Christmas.
