The "[Birdwatch 26 free guide](#)" refers to the RSPB's **Big Garden Birdwatch for January 2026**, where you register on their website ([rspb.org.uk/birdwatch](http://rspb.org.uk/birdwatch)) to get a free digital (or sometimes printed) guide with identification tips and tally charts to count birds in your garden for one hour. Participants count the maximum number of each species seen at one time and submit results online to help monitor bird populations, with resources available digitally to help with identification.

# St Mary's Class




We have had a great week this week in St Mary's class! In English, we explored adjectives and spent time planning our descriptive writing, making sure we had the best sentences! Year 2 looked at expanded noun phrases and Year 1 made sure they were using conjunctions while Reception were using finger spaces! We also wrote a recount in role of the mouse for his journey up to the top of the rock.

In Maths, Reception continued their work understanding 5 and played some games to subitise. Year 1 worked extremely hard to solve hard missing number problems on an empty number line where all of the numbers were hiding! Year 2 put all of their knowledge to the test as they completed mixed addition and subtraction problems in a variety of different ways.

In Computing, we all learnt about Pointillism Art and had a go at creating our own pictures using a feature on PurpleMash. All of us were able to use the tools in the tool bar to set our colours to the desired one and we made some beautiful desert images.

We have also been busy in Science sessions this week as we continued to discover more about the human body. This week, we looked at body parts that are inside the body. We learnt about the heart's function and felt our own heartbeats before and after exercise. We also learnt about the lungs, stomach and brain!



# St Elizabeth's Class



This week St Elizabeth class have been looking at the formal written method for multiplication. Year 3 have been partitioning numbers and adding to get the answer, and year 4 have been exchanging using the column method. Towards the end of the week, both year groups have moved onto division.

In English, we have been working on using speech to enhance our stories and using inverted commas correctly. We carried on reading 'Escape from Pompeii' and wrote about the volcano starting to erupt. We wrote diary entries to talk about how Tranio and Livia might feel.

In Science, we finished our Animals and Humans topic by exploring food chains. We categorised animals into consumers, predators and producers. In small groups we created the food chains our tables and drew arrows to show the transfer of energy.

In the Vine and Branches we retold the story of the Centurion's servant and spoke about how faith in God is important, and how the Kingdom of God is built.

In MyHappyMind we finished our appreciate module and thought about embedding our gratitude in everyday life. We considered our character strengths and how we should be grateful for these.



# St Catherine's Class



It has been another busy week for St. Catherine Class!

We started the week by reading the first few pages of our new text, *The Selfish Giant*. Everyone really enjoyed exploring the story and writing their own poems inspired by an image of the Giant's garden. There was some fantastic use of expanded noun phrases and relative clauses to add detail and depth to their writing – a great start to our new unit.

In maths, everyone has been working hard. Year 5 have been developing their understanding of fractions, while Year 6 have moved on to exploring ratio and scale factors. Both groups have shown resilience and determination as they practised strategies and applied them to a range of different challenges.

Tuesday was a highlight for two very different reasons. A team of basketballers represented the class at the Y5/6 FAVSP tournament at Helsby High, where they demonstrated excellent sportsmanship and skill, returning proudly with shiny bronze medals for coming third – well done, we are so proud of you! Meanwhile, the rest of the class took part in a very practical science lesson in the hall. Following on from Monday's learning about the circulatory system, the group used a range of props and equipment to create presentations explaining the system to others. They worked well in their groups and confidently used a wide range of scientific vocabulary.

Our busy week also included an exciting trip to Helsby High for Year 6, who were invited to watch their production of *Grease*. The children were inspired by the acting and singing and loved getting a glimpse of what life might be like at secondary school.
