

Moss Park Key Knowledge

- Tropical climates are hot and wet all year round this creates a humid climate
- A biome is an area with a similar climate and landscape, where similar animals and plants live
- A polar climate consists of cool summers and very cold winters usually with lots of snow
- Hot, arid deserts are located close to the equator
- A monsoon is a season of very heavy rainfall and cause wet and dry seasons throughout much of the tropics
- The UK has a temperate climate which has different weather in 4 different seasons

5 words to remember

biomes: including deserts, forests, grasslands, tundra and aquatic environments, biomes are defined by the climate, soil, organisms, flora and fauna of a large area; each biome consists of many ecosystems whose communities have adapted to the small differences in climate and the environment inside the biome

climate: the average weather pattern of a place over many years, in the long term; climates can be predominantly hot, cold, wet or dry; hot and wet; hot and dry; and so on – the climate of a place affects the soil, flora and fauna of that place, and impacts on human activity in a variety of ways fauna: animals

flora: plants

weather: our atmosphere from day to day, in the short term; weather varies, and the range of weather in a place is a characteristic of its climate
