

Spelling



In Years 2 - 6 the children learn a new spelling pattern every week as well as revising those already taught. They will also have the opportunity to revise the statutory spellings for their year group - these are called 'Challenge Weeks'.

In year 2, our spelling is assessed through 'dictated sentences'. This means that teachers read out words and sentences for the pupils to copy. Your child will be sent home with a group of words that contain a spelling pattern or rule to learn.

In the weekly dictation test, your child may be tested on those words or different words in the same family in order to see if they can apply the spelling rule. They may put the words into a sentence.

This year, your child will have access to **Spelling Shed** which is a scheme designed for pupils to practise their weekly spellings online via the use of the web link: https://play.spellingshed.com which is free of charge and/or can be accessed via the **Spelling Shed App**. Each week, your child will receive their spellings to learn via the **Spelling Shed** programme (alongside their printed copy) which they will also use for homework.

Each year group follows a week by week learning plan where children will have the opportunity to consolidate their learning in an independent task.

Spellings are taught in class each week with prior spellings revised at the start of each lesson.



The children's scores are monitored each week and words they struggle with are highlighted/written into their red spelling books.

Thursday: Mr Lowe's Sports Star Club (Sports & Games)


Please encourage your child to join a club. They can learn something new and have fun!

Learning at Home



Reading – Everyday (the single most important thing for all children to do at home)

<u>Homework – linked to what's happening in class. No new learning.</u>

Spelling homework is set on **Spelling Shed** and also provided within your child's yellow homework book. Maths homework is set on **MyMaths**. Any additional homework will be printed and stuck into their yellow homework books. Homework goes out on **Friday** to be completed by **Wednesday**.

Most homework will reinforce the learning that happens each week in either Maths or English. We go through it on Friday with the pupils. It might be linked to our topics, and it will be creative and manageable. We sometimes set whole school holiday homework challenges and projects – these are optional.

Try not to put pressure on your child, have fun working together, encourage them to talk about the how and why. Allow them to talk to you about what they have been doing in class.

Home Reading



Each child will be given a Reading Record and a Reading Book. We suggest that children read **everyday** at home either with a grown up or independently (Preferably with a grown-up/sibling where possible.)

Reading is so important for a child's development in all subjects!

Children's book bands are set at the appropriate level for each child and will be changed approximately once per term depending on the ability of the child.

- Reading books will be appropriate to your child's reading level regardless of their ability to read
- Reading books can be changed as required we encourage children to finish the book before changing it
- Children are expected to record comments and questions about what they have read in their reading records
- If a child has read 3x in a week and their parent has signed 3x then they will be given a raffle ticket and entered into our termly prize draw
- Parents always ask how they can help their child at home listen to them read, question them on what they have read and enjoy reading together!

How is my child doing in school?



As well as our regular marking and assessing of classroom work, your child will take tests in Reading, Spelling & Grammar and Maths each term. Most pupils will take the same test but we adjust this for pupils with additional learning needs. We use these tests to track progress across the year for your child and the class, and to plan future learning.

We let you know how your child is doing each term with a termly individual report from SONAR (our tracking system), 2x parents meetings and a full annual written report in July.
