

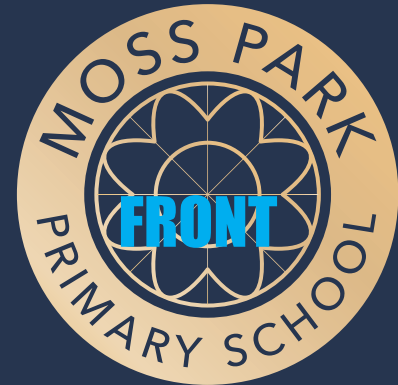

Your journey through Moss Park Primary

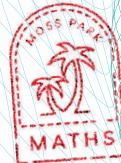
Every year of your journey at Moss Park Primary, you will be issued with a pupil passport.

The pupil passport will inform you of your destination and the checkpoints that you will visit along the way.

Our Pupil Passport effectively informs pupils and parents of the crucial end-of-year expectations, particularly highlighting areas where parental support can make a significant difference in their child's progress.

Buckle up, it's time to enjoy our journey together!

- ➔ Count in steps of 2, 3, and 5 forward and backward.
- ➔ Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 multiplication tables, including recognising odd and even numbers.
- ➔ Recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number (tens, ones).
- ➔ Order numbers from 0 up to 100; use $<$, $>$ and $=$ signs.
- ➔ Recognise, find, name and write fractions $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$ and $\frac{1}{3}$ of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity. Write simple fractions for example, $\frac{1}{2}$ of $6 = 3$ and recognise the equivalence of $\frac{1}{4}$ and $\frac{1}{3}$.
- ➔ Recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently, and derive and use related facts up to 100.
- ➔ Add and subtract numbers including: a two digit number and tens / ones.
- ➔ Tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past/to the hour and know the number of minutes in an hour and the number of hours in a day.



INSIDE FRONT

- ➔ Continue to apply phonic knowledge and skills as the route to decode words until automatic decoding has become embedded and reading is fluent.
- ➔ Develop pleasure in reading, motivation to read, vocabulary and understanding.
- ➔ Understand both the books that they can already read accurately and fluently and those that they listen to.



INSIDE BACK

- ➔ Start using some of the diagonal and horizontal strokes needed to join letters and understand which letters, when adjacent to one another, are best left unjoined.
- ➔ Write for a variety of purposes.
- ➔ Consider what they are going to write before beginning.
- ➔ Make simple additions, revisions and corrections to their own writing.
- ➔ Learn how to use: sentences with different forms: statement, question, exclamation, command.
- ➔ Expanded noun phrases to describe.
- ➔ The present and past tenses correctly and consistently, including the progressive form.
