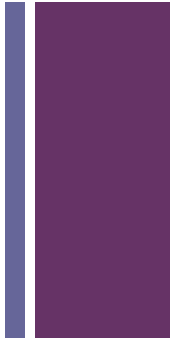

Groupings



Groups

- All groupings year 5 are based on assessments taken at key points last year as well as ongoing teacher assessments-written work is internally moderated within phases.

Differentiation

- The phase teachers plan together and differentiate the work to meet the needs of the pupils in their group. Work is differentiated between the groups but also within each group too.

Movement

- The groupings are flexible, for example, if a child is performing well within a unit they may move groups if they can manage the pace of the learning taking place. Conversely, if a child was finding a particular aspect of the unit tricky, they may need to move to a group at a more suitable pace.

+Reading

- Children need to read at home for about 20mins everyday.
- Please listen to your child read 3 times a week, chat and ask questions about their books.
- In school, we read in reading lessons. Reading skills will be practised in group sessions (comprehension with high quality questioning). Children also read their books with an adult through the week.

Reading is key to all areas of the curriculum and needs practising regularly to keep skills sharp and developed.

+Times tables

- It is important to continue to practise times tables on a daily basis.
- At the end of last year the average score out of 25 was 14. All children should have scored 25.
- In school, we are re-launching TT Rockstars and it will be very important to encourage your child to do this.
- In Maths, we will be doing times tables as much as possible and we will be testing on a weekly basis.
- At home, there are many things which you can do to help- other online websites, songs etc.
- They will need to know all their times tables for them to be confident in other areas of Maths.



Uniform

- As the children are representing the school it is important that the children are smart when coming to school.
- The children must be wearing school colours including socks and hair bands.
- The children must make sure that their feet are clean- mats can be used at the door and suitable footwear must be worn outside.
- Children must ensure that their shirts are tucked in.
- PLEASE NAME EVERYTHING!

+ Physical Education

- PE takes place on a Monday and a Wednesday.
- Full PE kit needs to be in school at all times. Trainers, tracksuit bottoms and tops are needed for cold and wet weather.
- PLEASE NAME EVERYTHING!
- If your child wears earrings, please make sure that they can take these out or have something to cover them up (tape/plasters).

+ Homework

- Homework will relate to an area of recent learning
- Maths homework will be given every week on a Friday. This will be a paper copy. Mathletics may also be set as extra activities where needed.
- SPaG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar) tasks will be set. This will be a paper copy. To be handed in by 9.00 am the following Friday by returning homework books to school.
- Spelling list to learn each week via Ed Shed/Spelling Shed. They will receive 20 spellings.
- On a regular basis there should be times tables practise. This can be done through TTRockstars.

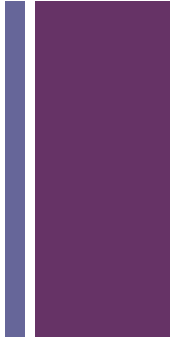

Developing Maturity



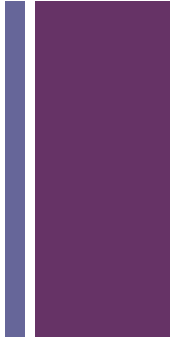
- Encourage independent learning

+ Behaviour and Discipline

- Use of class charter to set rewards and sanctions on Class Dojo.
- Children will receive a warning first before a dojo is taken away (depending on the severity of their behaviour).
- If after taking away a dojo and an inappropriate behaviour continues, a think sheet will need to be completed in their own time.
- A think sheet may need to be completed again depending on the severity of their behaviour.
