


Reading

- Children need to read at home for about 20mins everyday.
- Please listen to your child read 3 times a week, chat and ask questions about their books.
- In school, we read in phonics lessons. Reading skills will be practised in group sessions, which are our Favourite Five books (comprehension with high quality questioning). Children also read their books with an adult through the week.
- Reading is key to all areas of the curriculum and needs practising regularly to keep skills sharp and developed.
- Books will be changed every Friday




- As the children are representing the school it is important that the children are smart when coming to school.

- Children must ensure that their shirts are tucked in.




