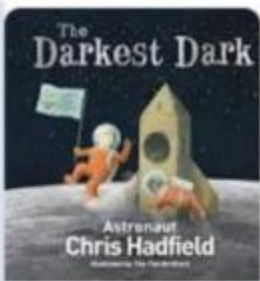
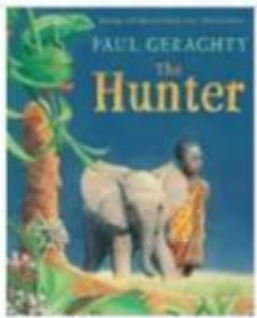

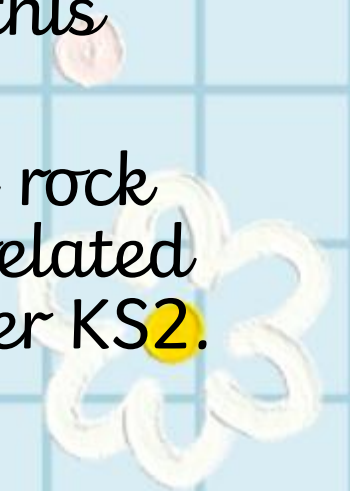

Maths in Year 5:

- Each maths lesson begins with a 20 minute Arithmetic Lesson followed by a 15 minute Mastery in Number session.
- Each objective in the Year 5 curriculum will be explored over 2 lessons. Lesson 1 involves all children focusing on fluency. In lesson 2, children who have mastered the fluency will move onto reasoning and problem solving questions. Children who struggled with the fluency will have a chance to revisit this before moving on.
- Please continue to encourage children to use times table rock stars as they will continue to use their times table and related division facts in their learning regularly throughout upper KS2.





Homework in Year 5:

- Maths, SPAG and Spelling homework will be set weekly on Friday and will be marked the following Friday.
- If there are any issues completing homework, please let us know before the Friday so that we can help to get this completed.
- Homework not completed on the Friday, without a reason why, will be completed in the children's lunchtime with an adult.
- 10 spellings will be sent out each week covering spelling rules throughout KS2. These will be tested on the following Friday.

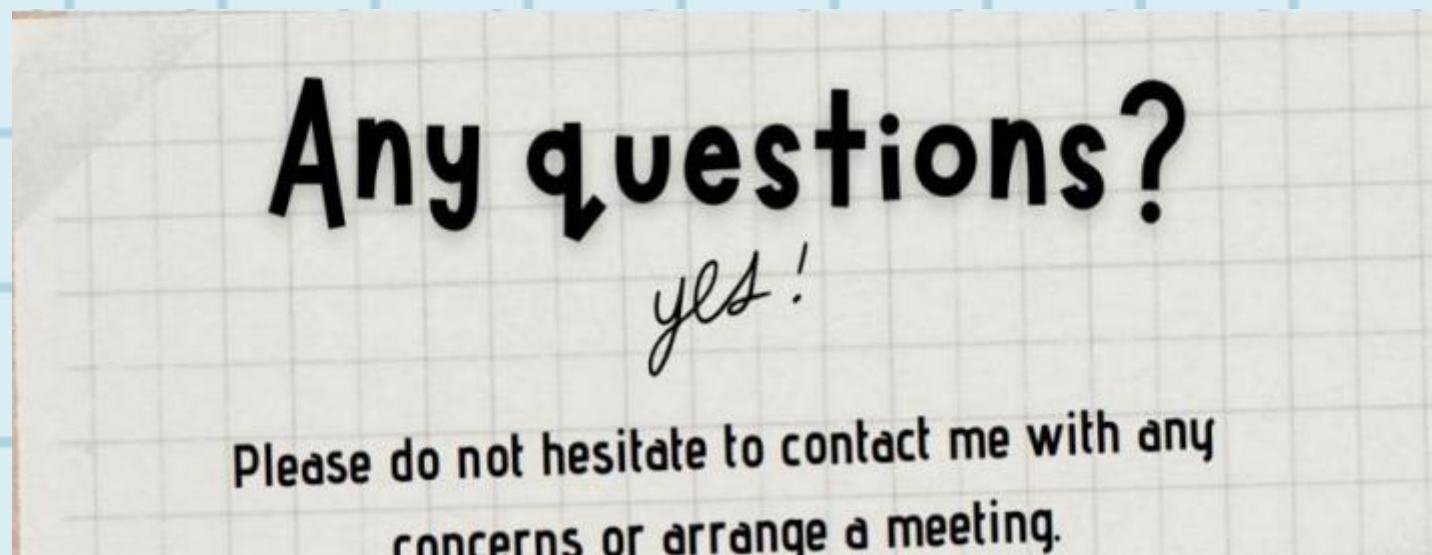
