Across the school, children have explored powerful themes such as microaggressions — understanding what they are and why they matter — and have been introduced to a range of inspirational Black figures including Ray Charles, Kerry Davies, and Dianne Abbott. We were thrilled to welcome DJ Spoony and Curtis Darroux, pioneers in the music industry, who led a memorable assembly that had both children and staff buzzing with excitement. From African flags and folk tales to the rhythm of African drumming lessons, our classrooms have been alive with learning and creativity. Year 2 are especially excited for their upcoming trip to the Unicorn Theatre to see Anansi the Spider, a story rich in cultural heritage and imagination.

We are incredibly fortunate to have such dedicated staff who bring these opportunities to life for our children. A heartfelt thank you to Ms West for her leadership and passion in guiding this important work.

Alongside our Black History Month celebrations, October has been packed with exciting trips and unforgettable experiences for our children. From the magic of the Harry Potter Studio Tour to the breathtaking views atop the London Eye, our pupils have explored some of the most iconic and educational sites our city has to offer.

They've delved into the fascinating world of communication at the Postal Museum, and even had the unique opportunity to visit the construction site opposite our school, learning firsthand about engineering, safety, and how buildings come to life.

NURSERY

During Black History Month this October, Nursery have been learning all about Brianna McCarthy and her amazing artwork! Brianna McCarthy is a self-taught artist from Trinidad and Tobago. She creates collage portraits. She explores identity, all types of beauty, stereotypes and representation of black women. Running alongside our All About Me focus, the children have been having such fun exploring collage and creating faces inspired by Brianna McCarthy's artwork. Do you like them so far?















DONALDSON CLASS

This week at our singing assembly, we learnt the words and makaton signed actions to the Bob Marley Song, 'Three Little Bird's'. We talked about the lovely message in the song about trying not not to worry, as it's all going to be alright. Of course, we are all here to hear any worries, should they arise!





AHLBERG CLASS

As part of Black History Month, Reception have been learning about the artist and celebrated textile designer Althea McNish. Althea McNish was an artist from Trinidad who moved to England in the 1950s. She became the first African Caribbean textile designer to earn an international reputation. The children used oil pastels on coloured paper to cream their own masterpieces inspired by Althea McNish.





HADID CLASS

As part of Black History Month, Year 1 have been enjoying the book Kiki's Magic Afro, where a young girl learns to truly love her natural hair and 'with love brings magic.'

This half term in RE, we have been learning about Sikhism and exploring why the 5 Ks are important to Sikhs. The children had the opportunity to look at the different objects and even tie their hair in a dastar.











SEACOLE CLASS

What an inspiring few weeks it has been! In celebration of Black History Month, the children have been learning about significant Black figures who have made a lasting impact throughout history. Their enthusiasm and curiosity have been wonderful to see.

Many children have brought in books about important individuals they've discovered at home and have proudly shared what they've learned with the class. These moments have sparked meaningful discussions and deepened everyone's understanding of the achievements and contributions of Black people across the world.

This celebration has also helped nurture a real love for reading. The excitement has extended beyond the classroom, with parents joining us to share their favourite childhood stories. These shared experiences have created a strong sense of community and connection, showing how reading can bring people together across generations.

Linked to our work as a Rights Respecting School, Article 30, which reminds us that every child has the right to learn about and celebrate their own culture and the cultures of others.

Through these activities, our children have shown respect, curiosity, and pride, demonstrating how learning about history can also strengthen our values of equality, respect, and inclusion.

In year 2, we have been learning about different significant black people. Here, the children have created posters for black history month and have written why it is important to celebrate black history month.










ATTENBOROUGH CLASS



John La Rose was a writer, publisher and activist who worked hard to make sure Black people's stories and cultures were heard and respected. He helped set up the first Black publishing company in Britain and the New Beacon Books bookshop. Benjamin Class wrote about his life and legacy and why his achievements should be remembered. We have also produced posters for our learning about Black History Month. These posters represent fairness, respect and unity to help make England a better, more equal place for everyone.











FIBONACCI CLASS

This October, Fibonacci Class has been immersed in a vibrant celebration of Black History Month, exploring the lives and legacies of influential figures who have shaped history through courage, creativity, and activism.

One of the highlights was our African drumming workshop—a joyful, energetic experience that had everyone moving to the beat! The children loved learning traditional rhythms and discovering how music connects people across cultures and generations.

We also spent time learning about the incredible Aretha Franklin. Known as the "Queen of Soul," Aretha was not only a legendary singer but also a powerful voice for civil rights and gender equality. Her music inspired millions and her activism helped bring attention to important social issues. Did you know she was the first woman ever inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame? The children were amazed by her achievements and the impact she made both on and off the stage.

It's been a truly inspiring month, filled with learning, creativity and reflection. I am so proud of how

engaged and thoughtful the children have been.


