Literacy

Learning Activities:

Write names, match names, identify names/pictures.

Develop fine motor through playdough, fine motor activities, funky fingers. Visual Phonics following Phase 2 sounds SATPIN. Begin CVC blending using SATPIN.

Continue Phase 1 – Environmental Sounds. Focus on animal sounds (farm, zoo, wild animals)
