Ideas for home learning

Please remember to read with your child every night – even just a few pages can make a big difference.

- **Talk about the meaning** – help your child link what they read or hear to their own experiences
- **Ask them about tricky words/new words** – What do they mean?
- **Ask them what happens next** – great practise for recall
- **Model expressive reading**, showing how intonation and expression bring the text to life
- **Ask questions** to deepen understanding. Can your child explain what is happening? Why is the character feeling like that?
- **Most importantly, enjoy the time together**
