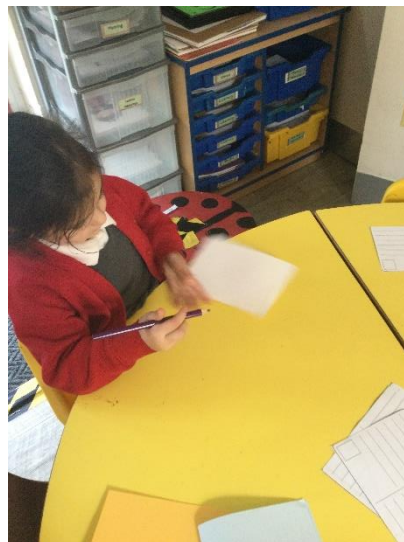
The parable of the 2 builder's experiment using sand, water and bricks. We spoke about this being our school bible story.
