What we are learning this half term!

Maths

We will continue to use our Phonics knowledge to read and write simple words and sentences.

Our key texts are:

The Scarecrow's Wedding - Julia Donaldson Chapatti Moon - Pippa Goodhart Leaf Man - Lois Ehlert The Nativity Story The Best Christmas Present EVER

SRE

We will be learning about safe and unsafe situations and who we can ask for help. We will also learn about keeping safe online.

Understanding the World

We will explore how toys have changed from the past.

We will explore special places in our community such as Mount Carmel Church and learn about different beliefs and celebrations. We will look at simple maps and learn how to draw information from them.

We will continue to identify our emotions and learn about the importance of exercise and healthy eating on our bodies. We will continue to build respectful relationships.

We will be exploring length and height using the language of comparison. We will count 10 items into a set and compare and order numbers to 10. We will learn about capacity and compare different capacities. We will develop our understanding of spoken numerals and matching them with written numerals. We will learn about one more and one less.

RE

We will learn about caring for ourselves, family, friends and God's world. We will learn about Remembrance Day. We will also learn about Baptism, The Annunciation, The Nativity, Advent and celebrating Christmas.

Expressive Arts and Design

We will create firework pictures and listen and move to a variety of music from different celebrations.

We will make hats and calendars, decorating them using a range of media and act out the Christmas story.

Physical Development

We will learn to explore space and how to use space safely. We will explore travelling actions, shapes and balances. We will copy, repeat and remember actions. We will use counting to help us keep in time with the music. We will explore dance through the world around us.

We will develop our fine motor skills by consolidating our tripod grips when writing and engage in fine motor activities such as dough gym and threading.
