Key Learning Highlights

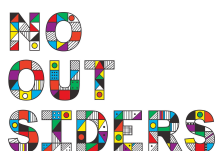
Here's a glimpse into the exciting learning journey your child will embark on this half-term, covering all aspects of the National Curriculum:

 English:

- **What we're reading:** Curiosity: The Story of a Mars Rover by Markus Motum & Cosmic by Frank Cottrell-Boyce
- **What we're writing:** Information Labels, Explanations, News Logs
- **Key skills:** using expanded noun phrases to convey complicated information, linking degrees of possibility using adverbs (perhaps, surely), relative clauses, parenthesis.

+ Mathematics:

- **Main topics:** Place Value & Four Operations (Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Division)
- **Key skills:** Read, Write, Order and Compare Numbers to 10 million; Factors and Multiples; Multiply up to a 4-digit number by a 2-digit number; Introduction to long division.



Science:

- **Main topics:** Earth & Space
- **Key questions:** How does the Earth and other planets move in the solar system? What are the planets within our solar system?
- **Engaging Activities:** Looking at the shape of the Earth, researching different planets within our solar system and their movement around the sun.
- **Prior Learning Connection:** Observing changes within seasons (including day length)

Geography: Kenya

- **Big Ideas:** Explaining the types of settlement and land use of some areas of Kenya. Explain the journey of tea from Kenya to being sold in the UK.
- **Engaging Activities:** Exploring land use patterns in Kenya and linking with land use patterns around Njoro.
- **Prior Learning Connection:** Similarities and differences between human and physical features of England and Kenya.

Design & Technology:

- **Focus:** To create a structural plan, design, make and evaluate a mars rover.
- **Key Skills:** Talk about key designers and engineers, strengthen materials using suitable techniques, evaluate ideas and the product against the original design.

Music:

- **Focus:** Happy by Pharrell Williams
- **Key Skills:** Listen & Appraise, singing the song, playing instruments with the song

Physical Education (PE):

- **Focus:** Hockey
- **Key Skills:** Sending and receiving, developing a range of attacking skills and strategies, supporting teammates, adapt tactics in a game if they are not working

Computing: Digital Literacy

- **Focus:** Discover, evaluate and share information over the internet and other digital communication technologies.
- **Key Skills:** Look at how the internet facilitates online communication and collaboration; complete shared projects online and evaluate different methods of communication; learn how to communicate responsibly by considering what should and should not be shared on the internet.

Religious Education (RE):

- **Focus:** What does it mean to live in a religiously diverse world?
- **Key Skills:** Analyse how religious diversity originated in the UK, identify the origins of religious and non-religious worldviews and reflect on my own identity in relation to historical and cultural influences after studying a range of different worldviews.

♥ Relationships & Health Education (RHE) & PSHE: HeartSmart & No Outsiders

- **Focus:** Getting more HeartSmart
- **Key Learning:** Body language, keeping our hearts soft but strong, when it is right to keep a secret and when secrets should be shared, marriage is a commitment of two people to each other, healthy eating
- We will also integrate our No Outsiders programme, promoting inclusivity, celebrating diversity, and ensuring every child feels valued and belongs within our school family.
- **Key No Outsiders text:** Dreams of Freedom: Amnesty International
- **Key No Outsiders learning:** To recognise our freedom
