The children then all completed a team crafting activity to create a stained-glass window showing the Angel Gabriel appearing to give the important message to the shepherds. Children also took part in a treasure hunt to find hidden items on the many, many beautifully decorated Christmas trees - one of which our Year 3s had created the decorations for. The children really enjoyed the visit and their behaviour and manners were fantastic. It was a joy to take them out of school. #### Year 3 Prehistory Day

This half term in History, Year 3 have started learning all about the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron age periods of prehistory. As part of this, they had a very knowledgeable visitor come into school, introducing this topic with a special 'Prehistory Day'. Children started off with a game, learning about what different foods and objects were available, grown or made during the different periods in Britain. They then looked at and sketched a vast range of artefacts from all three periods, gaining an excellent insight into how everyday objects changed over time. The day ended with everyone making a small bowl from clay with foods that would have been found and eaten at that time. It was a fun day and most importantly children learnt a lot of new and interesting facts that they will be able to reference during the rest of their learning.






#### Assemblies and Visitors

## **Climate Change**

This year we have made some bold and exciting decisions to improve our school's contribution to managing Climate Change. We have a comprehensive action plan and have created teams in school to drive this and it will now be an area we consistently work on moving forwards. One of our teams relates to further improving our curriculum. We want to educate and empower the children to be climate conscious citizens. Earlier this month we launched Climate Change action in our school which involved a whole day of Climate related activities. Children collected and analysed data, created poems and designed posters.

Other action we have taken this term:

- We have changed our rewards in the DOJO shop and have moved to having reused prizes or prizes that are more sustainable
- We have created more planting beds for vegetables and have started up an additional lunch time club to prepare these for growing.
- > We have improved our city-wide connections with food and are working with Food Works
- ➤ We have continued to promote active travel and every class now has an active mascot-look out they may come home for the weekend!
- > Our premises team have completed a carbon footprint audit which will enable us to measure improvements we make, especially around our gas and electric consumption.
